The Most Holy Trinity



Little Lucy was asked by her teacher to draw something special. Her teacher asked her what she was drawing. Lucy said, 'I'm drawing God!' Her teacher said. 'That's not possible. No one has ever seen God.' to which Lucy replied, 'They will soon, when they see my drawing!' We may smile at the naiveté of little Lucy, but the same can also be applied to ourselves when we seek to describe God. Some wise person once said, 'When we talk of God, the gates of heaven slowly close.' We don't get it. God is God and we are merely humans!

Nevertheless, today's Feast of the Blessed Trinity invites us to contemplate and reflect on the nature of God, Father, Son and Spirit.

The readings offer some small insights.

In the passage from Deuteronomy, Moses insists on the unique and supreme nature of God, excluding any other gods; but insists that this ultimate God has actually entered into the lives of this people through the Exodus and the experience of Sinai; God has acted 'before your eyes'. God has been directly involved with this people. God calls them to a relationship, a covenant.

In the passage from Romans, that relationship is an intimate personal one – it brings the believer into the very life of God – as children of God, and as heirs therefore – 'and co-heirs with Christ', as the 2nd Eucharistic Prayer reminds us.

The Gospel of Matthew gives us the command to make disciples and bring all people into the life of God, and that life is eternal: 'I am with you always: yes, to the end of time'.

Today's Feast is both about the utter immensity and incomprehensibility of God on the one hand, and the closeness of God on the other. We cannot fathom the former, but we can experience the later through love and prayer.


GOD, THE HOLY TRINITY

We pray that the Blessed Trinity will be glorified by all creatures when we say this prayer:




Answers: Dot to dot on front: a shannock represents the Holy Trinity. Trinity puzzle: Each Person IS MOT any other Person, but each Person IS OF
