# Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

The Eucharist is at the heart of everything. It is the 'centre and culmination of Christian life'.

(Lumen Gentium, 11)

In this year's readings for the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, Scripture speaks of the Eucharist as the sign of the covenant. The Eucharist is a lasting memorial of Christ's suffering, death and Resurrection, that reminds us of our obligation to make loving sacrifices for others. It teaches us the importance of community, the bond that results from Jesus' sacrifice.

We celebrate afresh the Last Supper at every Mass during the Eucharistic prayer. Jesus' selfless act of love becomes present to us once again, so that we may be transformed. The Eucharist is the Sacrament of our union with Jesus. It strengthens our charity and unity with Him and each other in a joint offering of his Body and Blood to the Father. To be fully in union with Christ means we are fully in union with each other. Jesus gives himself to us so that we in turn may give ourselves to others. So, having received from Jesus, He calls us to give something in return – not to him but to one another.

Strengthened by the grace of the Eucharist, in union with the Body of Christ go and spread the word of the covenant.

Lord Jesus Christ,
You feed us with your Body and Blood
to guide us on our pilgrim way and to strengthen us in holiness.
May we return to the Father all that he has given us through you.
Let our lives be broken in humble service and poured out in love.
May we always be grateful for the gift of the Eucharist in our lives,

# The Body and Blood of Our Lord

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

At the Last Supper, Jesus changed bread and wine into His own Body and Blood. He has the power to do this because He is God. He did this because He wanted to stay with us even after He died and went into Heaven.

Jesus comes to us in every Mass.

The priest takes the place of Jesus, saying the words that
Jesus said at the Last Supper, and the bread and wine
become the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of
Jesus even though they still look like bread and wine.

### How do I receive Communion well?

Be ready! Think about what is going to happen.
 Make sure that you don't have any big sins on your soul.
 If you do, then go to confession first.


 Don't eat or drink anything other than water or medicine for an hour before going to Holy Communion.
 This is a sign of respect for Our Lord.

3. After receiving Holy Communion, take some time to thank Jesus for coming to you and talk to Him. He is your best friend and loves spending time with you!
