"To what shall we compare the Kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants..." – Mk 4:30 -32

Gardening has always been a hobby of mine. I'm always amazed and heartened at the bounty and beauty of plants and flowers after much care has been given from when it has

been planted, till it is grown. It makes me glad when friends come by and enjoy the beauty of the plants and flowers in the back yard. In today's Gospel, our Lord compares the kingdom of God to a mustard seed – small in diameter; but grows into a large enough tree that birds of the air can shelter and rest in its branches. One can imagine the good soil in which the mustard seed was planted, and the nurture given for it to grow tremendously.

Like the tiny mustard seed, at times we may feel insignificant and have nothing to offer. At times, it seems our talents, our gifts, are not enough. That we do not have what it takes to make a difference in the lives of others, albeit our own lives. At times we feel so lost, we feel we are alone. We hide away. We close our selves to others. We close our minds and hearts to our Lord.

But just like the tiny mustard seed, we are packed with so much potential in us, in our soul. However, we need to be planted in good soil and cared for. Our Lord sows and nurtures us through His mercy and love. But do we accept the message of His Gospel to nurture us? Do we surrender to His divine will so that all that He has planned for us can come to fruition? Do we let the Holy Spirit in to our hearts so that we may be reminded of all that our Lord Jesus said, and help us understand the words of the Lord? And in so doing, like the mustard seed, we can grow tremendously that others may rest in us.

God created us in His image and likeness. He made us that we may bring forth His kingdom through us. All we have to do is believe this and let our Lord work in us and through us. So that we may be blessings to others, and others may see and feel God in our company.


