WHY ARE YOU SO FRIGHTENED?

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus asks his disciples "Why are you so frightened?" This is a question we should reflect on often because fear is at the heart of many of the problems and challenges we are facing in the world today. Jesus frequently tells his followers not to be afraid because he knows that we can easily become gripped by fear.

The following words about fear are sometimes attributed (apparently incorrectly) to Nelson Mandela. Nevertheless, they are worth considering.

"Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness that frightens us. We ask ourselves, 'Who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, fabulous?'

"Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small doesn't serve the world. There's nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are born to manifest the glory of God that is within us. It's not just in some of us. It's in everyone, and, as we let our light

shine, we consciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others."

We all have personal gifts and talents to share with others. I invite you to reflect on your gifts and talents and ask yourself this question: Am I using my gifts and talents to manifest the glory of God

that is within me? Let's not shrink from manifesting the glory of God that is within us because we are frightened.

Parish update on Cathedral base isolation

The consultant team has worked through a preliminary design for base isolation which has been costed by the contractor and quantity surveyor. All the information has been presented to the Parish Leadership Team, Parish Finance Committee and Archdiocesan committees in the last few weeks. A decision has been made but before this is announced the decision needs to be communicated and finances worked through with the Government Shovel Ready project funders to determine the impact of the decision on available Government funding. As soon as we have final decisions around the funding this will be communicated to the parish.


