"Go you are sent"

"Go you are sent". The theme of the 2017 Archdiocesan Synod, and the words of dismissal that we hear at the end of all Masses. But why are we sent and to where are we sent?

We are baptised into a Christian community, baptised as priest, prophet, and king. Our baptism tasks us with sharing in the mission of the church; sent with, and to, those with whom we worship - sent to serve, to welcome, to receive, to teach, to advocate, to spread the good news of Jesus Christ, and to share our time, talent, and treasure with our neighbour. But where are you and I individually, and as part of our parish community, being sent today?

Listening and responding to calls from the community, voiced during workshops over the past couple of years, our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) recently renewed our parish mission and vision statement to clearly reflect our baptismal call - "To joyfully share God's love. To be a missionary people united in the hearts of Jesus and Mary". Focussed on our mission statement and our parish displacement, the PPC, in consultation with the Parish Finance and Liturgy committees, has prepared a three-year parish plan journeying towards the reopening of the Cathedral.

This year the pastoral plan involves the PPC and Liturgy teams identifying, forming, and training teams to be co-responsible for the needs of our community and outreach. They wish to set up teams that will take Holy Communion to the sick and housebound; visit new parishioners; prepare families for baptisms, walk alongside bereaved families, and fundraise for the strengthening and restoration of the Cathedral. And now that we know that we will be returning to the Cathedral sometime next year we will need assistance in preparing for the physical re-opening and return to our Cathedral.

Sharing in the work of Jesus, witnessing to our faith isn't always easy, and doesn't always involve only tasks that we are confident in doing. It does however provide us with opportunities for spiritual and personal growth, to grow our ministry, skills, and faith, both individually and as community. What are you being sent to today? How will you respond to the opportunities for witnessing in our community?

Sign of Peace—The exchange of peace can be by spoken word, by a gesture such as bowing, or by a pause for silent prayer for peace.

Holy Water Fonts—are to remain without Holy Water.




