Food for eternal life

In last week's Gospel Jesus miraculously fed the 5000. This week the story continues as we hear Jesus blatantly state to those who followed him across the lake, seeking more food, that they are not looking from Him for the right reason or seeking the right food from him. We hear Him tell them not to focus on food that cannot last and that He is the food that they should be seeking, the food of eternal life – 'all who believe in Him will never be hungry'.

This week Jesus challenges us to face our deeper hunger, our spiritual hunger. He urges us to seek food for that, food that he can give us. While physical food and material goods sustain our physical life here on earth, the food Jesus gives sustains life permanently.

In today's world do we recognise the nourishment of the "true bread from heaven"? Our world today is very competitive and materialistic, valuing food that cannot last.

Highlighting a terrible symptom of this worldly hunger, this Sunday is World Day of Trafficking and Slavery. Trafficking and modern slavery is the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harbouring or receipt of persons by means of deception, fraud, threat, force, or other forms of coercion, of abduction or abuse of power and control over another, or is in a position of vulnerability - for the purpose of exploitation.

As we ponder upon our source of life in Jesus, may we take time to consider our personal response in raising awareness in ourselves and others of and support for those who find themselves in exploitive situations.

Have you ever been hungry?


