#### SOME THOUGHTS ON THE MYSTERY OF THE EUCHARIST

For many years I have pondered the mystery of the Eucharist. Yet no matter how hard I try to get my head around it, I always feel a sense of inadequacy.

Ronald Rolheiser (a priest and writer on spirituality and theology) has observed that there are many faces of the Eucharist. In other words, there are lots of different perceptions of the Eucharist. For some it is a meal, for others it is a sacrifice. For some it is a ritual act, sacred and set apart, for others it is a community gathering, the more mess and kids the better. For some it is a ritual remembrance, for others it is a celebration of God's presence with us today. For some it is a celebration of the Last Supper, something to be done less frequently, for others it is God's daily feeding of his people. For some it is a celebration of reconciliation, a ritual that forgives and unites, for others unity and reconciliation are pre-conditions for its proper celebration.

The Eucharist is all of the above and much more because it is multifaceted. We cannot adequately explain the Eucharist. The mystery of God's love for us in the Eucharist is beyond words. We cannot nail down such a profound mystery. As Ronald Rolheiser says, "Any attempt to nail down its full meaning will forever come up short because it will eventually get up and walk away with the nail!"

A final thought - The following words of Emeritus Pope Benedict in his first encyclical letter 'Deus Caritas Est' (God is Love) remind us that the Eucharist is not meant to be a private, individualistic experience: "A Eucharist which does not pass over into the concrete practice of love is intrinsically fragmented." The Eucharist calls us to love in practical ways, witnessing to God's love, especially for those who are vulnerable and marginalised or where human life and dignity is threatened. Let's remember Saint Augustine's maxim when we receive the Body of Christ: "Become what you receive and receive what you are."

# **DEDICATION** — AND A HYMN



In 1838 the first Bishop in Aotearoa, Jean-Baptiste Pompallier, dedicated these islands to Mary Assumed into Heaven.

This year, on the Solemnity of the Assumption, 15 August, our bishops will reaffirm this dedication. They have asked that the same re-dedication rite be used at all Masses next Sunday, and every congregation has been asked to sing the hymn 'Mō Maria', which Pompallier himself wrote and set to a French tune.

The Liturgy Office has prepared two videos to introduce the hymn. The first <a href="https://youtu.be/sDFehbr8g6w">https://youtu.be/sDFehbr8g6w</a> is a documentary style introduction to the hymn, the second <a href="https://youtu.be/c2Yq4rl6Ml8">https://youtu.be/c2Yq4rl6Ml8</a> a performance of the hymn with words. A third video will include hints on pronounciation — but it's not a difficult hymn and the melody is beautiful.

Jean-Baptiste Pompallier (1802-71) was appointed Vicar Apostolic of Western Oceania in 1837, and almost immediately led the first Catholic mission to Aotearoa, based in the Hokianga. In 1850 he became the first Bishop of Auckland. You can read more about him in the Dictionary of New Zealand Biography, <a href="here">here</a>.
