

Te Ara a Maria - Mary's Way

In 1838 Bishop Pompallier dedicated our country to Our Lady Assumed into Heaven during the celebration of his first Mass in New Zealand at Totara Point in the Hokianga on the 13th January 1838.

This weekend Catholics throughout New Zealand join in the renewal of the country's dedication to Our Lady. Our Bishops from throughout New Zealand are gathering here in Wellington this weekend at St Mary of the Angels for this re-dedication. Sunday is the 15th of August and a Holy Day of Obligation for the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and a most appropriate date to undertake this rededication. To mark this occasion our



Bishops have commissioned a new icon artwork of Mary by Christchurch artist, Damien Walker.

We are all invited to join in prayer for the renewal of the dedication in our Parishes. Here in the Cathedral Parish this weekend we will join with Parishes throughout the country in prayer and song to mark the rededication. In the days to come we will also be able to make our own personal pilgrimage to honour Our Lady and pray before the new Icon installed at St Mary of the Angels. These events are a direct response by our Bishops to a nationwide call to rededicate New Zealand to Mary driven by the challenges of the pandemic and lockdown during 2020. What better time to honour Our Lady and refocus our prayer on Jesus through Mary, His Mother.



The Assumption of Our Lady

Today we are celebrating the feast of the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. When her life on earth was over, Our Lady was assumed- taken body and soul- into Heaven to be with God.


When we die, our bodies will be buried and break down. This happens because of original sin. When Adam and Eve committed the first sin, people could no longer live forever on earth. But Our Blessed Mother was kept free from original sin so that she could be the perfect mother for Jesus. Our Lady suffered from some of the effects of original sin, but God would not permit her body to decompose in the tomb.


At the Annunciation, when the angel Gabriel brought Mary the message that God wanted her to be His mother, she gave herself totally to God. All through her life, even when He died on the cross, she did everything for Jesus. So God decided that instead of being buried like everyone else, His holy mother should come, body and soul, into Heaven.
