"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." Mark 8:35

A few years ago, some friends were having a hard time. Life was difficult, they were struggling. Things were getting on top of them. They were looking for a way out.

One day I was invited for a meal. My friends asked what I thought about a book they had discovered, titled "The Secret." The so-called 'secret' is about the law of attraction, that you become what you're attracted to. So, if you want increased wealth you think about increased wealth, if you want improved health, you think about improved health. If you think positively, you will create life-changing results such as increased wealth, health, and happiness.

It's natural for us to ponder questions about life and happiness. Positive thinking is a good thing, but the ideas behind "*The Secret*" are highly questionable. My advice to my friends was to give it a miss. We have our book, the Bible!

This Sunday's scripture readings give us insights into how we might respond to the questions and challenges of life. In the Gospel Jesus says, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." The prophet Isaiah refers to the servant of the Lord who suffers. He suffered, but he was sustained in his trials by the firm belief that God was with him. St James points out that self-giving through good works is necessary to live the faith that we profess.

"Go Now You Are Sent Forth" is one of my favourite hymns, which is sometimes sung at the end of Mass. It's a favourite because it's easy to sing, and because of the challenge contained in these words: "Go now you are sent forth, to live what you proclaim; to show the world you follow Christ in fact, not just in name." Following Christ in fact, not just in name means embracing the cross, having the courage to bring our suffering to Christ and ensuring that our faith is accompanied by good works of love and compassion.

A CULTURE OF ENCOUNTER : BE THE CHURCH

Fratelli Tutti

Social Justice Week 2021 takes place from 12 - 18 September. The theme this year is "A Culture of Encounter: Be the Church" / "He Ahurea Tūtaki ki Ētahi atu: Me Noho Ko Koutou te Hāhi." This theme on encounter and community was inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical, Fratelli Tutti (2020).

In Pope Francis' 2015 encyclical, Laudato Si', he observed that social cohesion is being threatened in today's world and spoke of the importance of cultivating meaningful relationships with each other. Pope Francis continued this theme when he released his third encyclical Fratelli Tutti – Brothers and Sisters all, based on the theme of fraternity and social friendship.

In this encyclical, Pope Francis calls us to build a better world based on fraternal love. He warns all people that "the sense of belonging to a single human family is fading" (Fratelli Tutti, #30), and as our world continues to grapple with the COVID-19 pandemic we must not dismiss the sense that we all share a common humanity.

Pope Francis challenges us all to restore a sense of closeness and create paths of renewed encounter. He redirects us to the life of St Francis of Assisi in calling for "a love that transcends the barriers of geography and distance." (Fratelli Tutti, #1.)

With the addition of Fratelli Tutti, the body of Catholic social teaching (CST) has deepened further. Showing the importance for applying Christ's teaching to the issues of today, CST principles provide the basis for action in the community as we seek to follow Christ's example. With a focus on fraternity, social friendship, encounter and community, Fratelli Tutti explores the CST principles that we highlighted in our SJW resources from last year.



I am writing to share how my family and I became involved with Sacred Heart Cathedral's church ministry. It actually all started when during one of the Vigil Masses, a lay pastoral leader came up in front and had an impassioned plea to the Cathedral parishioners to help out in various church ministries.

When I heard of the call, I thought to myself surely there will be many other parishioners who would be keen and more able than me to assist and contribute. The plea to serve didn't really strike a chord with me until one night, after the celebration of the Vigil Mass, I had a tap on the back from someone. It was Fr. James Lyons who approached me and without beating around the bush, asked me if I wanted to be part of the Church Pastoral Council. Who would dare to say no to Fr. James, especially if he looked straight into you with sincerity and kindness. That night, I told myself I'd give it a go.
