For a synodal Church

Today Jesus' teaching reminds us that in a world filled with suffering caused by power communic participation mission struggles, that as Christian communities we are called to display a different way of being human. He wants our lives of discipleship to be lives of service, lived in love and justice. As disciples the foundation of our identity is to be at the service of others, service that mirrors and reflects Jesus' self-sacrificing service.

Jesus challenges us to transform the demand of James and John from 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you', to 'Teacher we want to do for you and for many whatever you ask of us.'

The theme of the Synod, being celebrated across the world this weekend, is 'For a synodal church of communion, participation and mission'. The word 'synodality' means 'walking together'. Pope Francis has for eight years been calling for a more decentralised Church, a Church marked by collaboration and consultative decision making. He wants to hear from everyone.

Over the coming weeks please make time to respond to Francis' call, to delve into and respond to, at least one of, the Synod questions. Consider participating in a small group gathering and listen to the Holy Spirit speaking to you through discernment with others. Consider inviting others, especially those that may feel disconnected from the church, those we do not worship with, including those temporarily displaced due to the Cathedral closure to join you. Or just personally reflect and respond.

In God's Kingdom the greatest are those who are willing to serve. Jesus came among us seeking to serve rather than to be served! Discipleship invites us to live the values of God's Kingdom, the exact opposite values to those of the world of power politics, individualism, and consumerism. May we be great imitators of Jesus in all that we do and speak.

From Cardinal John's newsletter - 14 October 2021

Last Sunday in his homily for the opening Mass to begin the 2-year process of consultation for the Synod on Synodality, *Communion, Participation and Mission* Pope Francis encouraged all Catholics to become "*experts in the art of encounter*". He wasn't just talking about that renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, that kind of encounter needs to be something we do every day unfailingly, he says. He was speaking of an encounter meaning *meeting our fellow Catholics by being ready to listen to them with our hearts and our ears*.

We have all been invited, every single baptised person in the world to meet other Catholics to listen to them, and to allow God to help us to walk together "wherever we are". Pope Francis speaks of this as the Synod process of consultation beginning this Sunday 17 October, as "an adventure in which everyone must take part". He wants us to make this an adventure, not just another task to be done, but an adventure in which we imagine together the future of the Church. He had a wonderful line in his homily where he said "Let us not soundproof our hearts; let us not remain barricaded in our certainties".

Now is the time for all of us to genuinely encounter one another, listen to one another as we journey through life. Now is the time to listen to one another and to hear with our hearts, and not just our ears. This is for the good of the Church, this is for our good. Pope Francis longs for a Church in which we are open to listening to one another. That means everyone.

Over these next few weeks look for opportunities to become *experts in the art of encounter*, to engage in the Synod consultation process, to feed in your ideas of what the Church should be in the future, and above all let's pray together for the success of this incredible adventure we have been invited to join in with over the next couple of years.

As a Greek, he takes care to explain to Gentile readers Jewish customs and the meaning of Hebrew words.

SACRED HEART CATHEDRAL PARISH FOODBANK

Our foodbank has been working well and is based at the Cathedral. All parishioners are encouraged to bring an item when they attend services, and the support has been immense. Most of the food in recent years has been delivered to the Sisters of Charity at Cannons Creek.

Obviously, the need is great. The Sisters serve the community with utter commitment, delivering packages and specific item support to the community. Nothing is wasted. They have no governance costs. They serve the neediest in the wider Porirua/Cannons Creek region and provide a holistic service. Many foodbanks open for a set time each week and not on public holidays and many families struggle to get there. However, the Sisters supply support to families at all times including those that contact them or whom they visit at any time.

Over the years our parish has also delivered substantive groceries to the St Vincent de Paul foodbank in Newtown. This bank distributes any overflow widely and has refrigeration.

Sacred Heart Cathedral parish has had a strong tradition in social support with many past parishioners involved in leading changes for the socially disadvantaged. One previous parishioner of Sacred Heart, well known to many New Zealanders, is the Honourable Micky Savage. He led the development of social welfare policy in New Zealand as the first Labour Prime Minister. Remembering and learning his story is an inspiration to youth. As a response to the need in New Zealand for improved dental health he vacated Premier House in Tinakori Road and converted it into a dental clinic for children.

Sadly, today as a surgeon, I can attest to the fact that child dental health is again in an appalling state. One need from the foodbank is for regular supplies of toothpaste and brushes for children. Sugar drinks are still actively promoted to kids in our community. Treatment delays in what I believe is a broken health system and limited primary educational support impacts the most vulnerable of society. Providing brushes and toothpaste through the food bank is critical to many families and is one way we can help to address this. Other supplies that are very helpful are tinned items such as fish, tuna, soups, pasta, flour, sugar, cereals, biscuits, some treats, rice, rice and more rice, nappies, female sanitary products, soap and all good staples.

Thank you for your continued support of our parish foodbank, it really does make a difference to the lives of many in our communities. It is not unusual for cash to be donated for the foodbank to buy fresh vegetables and meat. If you would like to do this, please contact the parish office.
