## DREAMING OF A SYNOD

Since he was elected Bishop of Rome in 2013, Pope Francis has revived and strengthened one of the important legacies of the Second Vatican Council – the Synod of Bishops. These Synods, with bishops representing every local church, meet every few years, with a particular theme. Under his two predecessors, the discussion was carefully constrained and there were sometimes lists of topics that should on no account be mentioned.

Francis has made synods vehicles of discernment, which requires not only careful listening but honest speech. In 2015 the Synod topic was the family, in 2017, youth; and in 2019, the Amazon basin. Each produced some significant thinking on the church and the world. The 2021 Synod was to focus on process – a synod on synodality. Francis has postponed this until 2023, and asked bishops' conferences to ensure a wide discussion on 'communion, participation and mission' in the church. We will be reminded often enough that a synod is not a parliament, and that discernment is not about majority votes. That is true enough, but nor s hould those principles become an excuse for inertia. Nor should the imperative of mission lead us to ignore the state of the church. We are invited in this process to reflect on a number of themes, including mission, relationships with other Christian communities, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and authority and participation in the church.

In thinking about the Synod themes, we should remember, as Vatican 2 noted, that 'the Church has always had the duty of scrutinising the signs of the times and of interpreting them in the light of the Gospel'. That is the duty of each one of us. These times include major challenges: the ongoing pandemic, the climate emergency, and sometimes grave economic inequality. Francis has often reflected on these. Last weekend, addressing popular movements, he named some points of urgent action.

He also invited us all to 'dream together... right now our brains and hands are not enough, we also need our hearts and our imagination; we need to dream so that we do not go backwards'.
