A King like no other

"Yes, I am a king. I was born for this ..." - not quite the words you would expect to hear from a man, who in Monday's gospel – responded to the cries of a blind beggar and healed him and then in Tuesday's gospel, wanders off to the home of a man who stole from others for a meal.

In modern society, royalty, acting like this, would be frowned upon and not considered to be in line with protocol. Jesus was and is a different King, a King like no other. I am an accountant and therefore like to compare things (you will get a bit of that at Mass this weekend) so I thought I would compare a typical king to Jesus:

The typical King	Jesus, our King
Born in a palace to rich and famous parents	Born in a stable to parents who were not famous, powerful or wealthy.
Visited by the wealthy	First visitors were poor shepherds
Surround themselves with educated people	Recruited fisherman and tax collectors to be his friends
Dines with the rich and famous	Sat and ate with people who were usually rejected or despised by society
Wealthy	Owned nothing, but did share his greatness possession with the world, God's love.

Jesus came into this world, not as a King to be served, but rather to serve. The Kingdom of God, is the Kingdom of love because God is love. Just as Jesus Himself modelled, we too are called to be servants for each other.

Many of us will never get to meet royalty but we do have an opportunity to meet Jesus, our King, each day. He is in the sick, the poor, the homeless and the lonely. All we must do is open our hearts and eyes and we will see Christ the King in everyone we meet. *Clint Ramoo (Finance Committee Chair)*

The Diocesan Phase will take place between October 2021 and April 2022. In the Archdiocese of Wellington responses are invited up until 30 April 2022. After this date they will be analysed and collated into a response from the Archdiocese of Wellington. The New Zealand Bishops will consider responses from the six dioceses at their next meeting after 30 April. The six diocesan responses will be sent to the Synod Office in Rome.

A thought on Advent from the American Cistercian monk, Thomas Merton (1915-1968): 'It is important to remember the deep, in some ways anguished seriousness of Advent, when the mendacious celebrations of our marketing culture so easily harmonize with our tendency to regard Christmas, consciously or unconsciously, as a return to our innocence and our own infancy. But the church, in preparing us for the birth of a "great prophet," a Saviour, and a Prince of Peace, has more in mind than seasonal cheer. The Advent mystery focuses the light of faith upon the very meaning of life, history, humanity, the world, and our own being. In Advent, we celebrate the coming, and indeed the presence, of Christ in our world'. (from Thomas Merton, 'Advent: Hope or Delusion?' (1950).)
