### STOP LOOK AND LISTEN

The last two years have brought all of us many new challenges. Covid has brought new stresses to our everyday lives with confusion and uncertainty about where the world might be going. But Christmas is coming, summer has arrived and we have so much to be grateful for and joyful about.

So make this Advent a time to stop and listen and once more find the space for hope and joy as we wait with anticipation for the birth of Jesus. This weekend the first reading is from Baruch (5:1-9). It is a beautiful poem offering comfort and consolation to God's people with a commitment to mercy and justice. We are urged, 'take off your dress of sorrow and distress, and put on the beauty of the glory of God'. We can only be empowered by the words, 'wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven'. How can we remain despondent and fearful when we hear that 'God will guide in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort'. We are his beloved and he will protect us. But these words also call us to go out and act with justice and mercy using the power of his glory. Throughout the reading the imagery created is extravagant and joyous, an exultant litany of good news – a reminder to be joyful when it has been difficult to find much joy in our world.

Wishing you a joy filled Advent season.

## MASSES UNDER THE NEW COVID "TRAFFIC LIGHT" FRAMEWORK

Wellington is now in the "Orange setting" and under these restrictions, and as advised last weekend, all Masses in our parish are now available for access only with a "My Vaccine Pass". Various other gatherings operating from parish premises will fall into both the restricted and unrestricted category. Please check advertising notices, or with the coordinators of the gatherings to ascertain their category. If you need assistance getting a pass please contact Frank in the parish office.

The changes to the new access system requires extra processes to enable us to gather, which in turn requires extra people to assist us to meet the obligations placed upon us. If you are able to offer your assistance please contact Debbie or Frank in the parish office or one of the Mass Co-ordinators.

Your co-operation, patience and help is appreciated as we settle into these new requirements. We ask that you please:

- 1. Arrive early for Mass to allow time for everyone to be seated before Mass begins.
- 2. Have ready your Vaccine Pass available for sighting/verifying;
- 3. Continue to scan in using the My-Covid app or manually sign in;
- 4. Wear a mask and sanitise on your way into the church







In today's gospel, John the Baptist comes into the story. John is a challenging saint - in Luke's account, which we hear in other years, John calls the people a 'brood of vipers' and warns them that they will be held accountable. He exhorts the people to live in justice with their neighbours to share their goods, to fulfil the responsibilities of their jobs with integrity, and to remember that all are God's people.

Saint John's feast is 24 June, the edge of midsummer. Traditionally in Ireland, farmers would light bonfires on St John's Eve, 23 June, with the prayer: ""In the honour of God and of St. John, to the fruitfulness and profit of our planting and our work, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen". Some gardeners might like this prayer: it's just as good in our midwinter when the broad beans get planted.



Advent is a time of joy, when we TURN happily look forward to the coming AWAY of Jesus. Today's Gospel reading tells about how Saint John the Baptist went around telling everyone to repent and prepare for the S[NS! coming of the Messiah.

An Advent wreath is a symbol of the coming of Jesus, our Light, into the world. It has three purple candles and one pink candle. One candle is lit on the first week of Advent, and one more is added every week until Christmas. Every week it gets a bit brighter because we are getting closer to Jesus' coming at Christmas.

The purple candles stand for repentance- being sorry and making up for

our sins. The pink candle represents joy. It is lit on the third week of Advent because we rejoice that the waiting is half over.
