Third Sunday of Advent – Gaudete Sunday

Today, I came across this quote:

"Everyday, we are engaged in a miracle which we don't even recognise: a blue sky, white clouds, green leaves, the black, curious eyes of a child, our own two eyes. All is a miracle."

It reminds me of how children, especially the very young and babies, are captivated by wonder, newness, surprise, and joy, and how as we grow older everything becomes so-so, mundane, even boring.

Today's readings are meant for those with childlike eyes and hearts!

It is called 'Gaudete Sunday' - a call to rejoice and celebrate! St Paul is emphatic in the very positive tone in this part of his letter to the Philippians. For believers the coming of the Lord is a cause for great rejoicing.

That is very much the tone of the passage from Zephaniah too: exult for joy because God has repealed the sentence of judgement and instead tells his captive and broken people that there is no need for fear: the wonderful image of God dancing with shouts of joy for you is remarkable.

But if the coming of the Lord is a cause of great joy - which of course it is - it is also a cause of challenge. The crowds ask John the Baptist: 'What must we do?'. It is our question also. How do we respond to this great news that the Lord is approaching?



John offers very careful guidance to the crowds, specific to each group - it is always a matter of practical justice. That is the great challenge. John the Baptist comes as the great herald of hope, but also as the one who challenges every believer to respond to the joyful news by a life of justice and concern for others - that indeed is the sign of the Messianic age that is being ushered in.

MASSES UNDER THE NEW COVID "TRAFFIC LIGHT" FRAMEWORK

Wellington is now in the "Orange setting" and under these restrictions, and <u>as previously advertised</u>, All Masses in our parish are now available for access only with a "My Vaccine Pass". Various other gatherings operating from parish premises will fall into both the restricted and unrestricted category. Please check advertising notices, or with the coordinators of the gatherings to ascertain their category. If you need assistance getting a pass please contact Frank in the parish office.

The changes to the new access system requires extra processes to enable us to gather, which in turn requires extra people to assist us to meet the obligations placed upon us. If you are able to offer your assistance please contact Debbie or Frank in the parish office or one of the Mass Co-ordinators.

Your co-operation, patience and help is appreciated as we settle into these new requirements. We ask that you please:

- 1. Arrive early for Mass to allow time for everyone to be seated before Mass begins.
- 2. Have ready your Vaccine Pass available for sighting/verifying;
- 3. Continue to scan in using the My-Covid app or manually sign in;
- 4. Sanitise on your way into the church and wear a mask whilst inside the church.



How can you be like Saint John the Baptist and show other people the way to Jesus?


