The pandemic began two years ago. Perhaps the hardest thing has been the successive variants after the first wave - Delta, now Omicron, each coming as we might have hoped it was over. The pandemic has affected some people in our country much more seriously than others, but it has affected everyone and continues to affect everyone. It would be easy to think, too, that the values of solidarity and community, which have served us so well over the last two years, are breaking down – especially in the streets around our Cathedral in recent days.

I find myself feeling angry about the crowd that has been around parliament. Angry, and confused, because the right to protest is important, but I find some – a lot – of the goings-on thoroughly disturbing. As Pope Benedict XVI said, 'individual rights, when detached from a framework of duties which grants them their full meaning, can run wild, leading to an escalation of demands which is effectively unlimited and indiscriminate. An overemphasis on rights leads to a disregard for duties'. So, I find some words in today's gospel very difficult to hear: 'bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly... do not judge... do not condemn...'.

A while ago I read a biography of Raymond Hunthausen, Archbishop of Seattle 1975-91. Reading the signs of the times, Hunthausen became an outspoken opponent of the US government's expansion of its nuclear arsenal, and indeed of nuclear deterrence. He withheld a proportion of his income tax and donated it to a peace organisation. For this and other reasons, he was not popular in the Vatican, but something of a celebrity among the peace movement of the time.

On one occasion Hunthausen addressed a large protest at the nuclear submarine base in his archdiocese. Instead of the ringing denunciations which some in the crowd expected, he spoke of reconciliation, listening to the other side – the Navy - and said that 'We are all... caught up in the same system. We all struggle to do the best we can to live according to our beliefs'. While uncompromising in his judgement of nuclear weapons – and joining in an attempt to blockade a Trident submarine - he managed to avoid demonising those on the other side of the argument. Judging actions and judging people are not the same thing.



MASSES UNDER THE NEW COVID "TRAFFIC LIGHT" FRAMEWORK

The "Red" setting of the Covid-19 alert level has meant a few changes to how we gather for Masses.

- As advised earlier via email https://mcshwellington.org/masses-under-red-light-covid-protection-framework/ we are now required to register again for all weekend Masses. Please remember you will need to register each week.
- On-line Registrations are open from Wednesday 9.00am till midday Friday. https://www.wn.catholic.org.nz/mass-registrations/ If you are unable to register online but want to attend a Saturday Vigil or Sunday Mass, please phone the Parish Office.
- Limits on numbers are also in place again and take into account the mandated 1m social distance.
- Face masks are now also required to be worn and you will be unable to enter without a face mask from 3rd February.
- During the pandemic the dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is still in place.

This pandemic is very challenging to all on many levels. As Omicron spreads, and we respond to restrictions to slow down the virus and protect those vulnerable and immune compromised, if you find that you need assistance, like getting groceries, that family and friends are unable to help you with please reach out to us in the parish office and we will try to put you in touch with someone to help. If you would like to put your name on a list of people available to help others if needed, please email the parish office with your offer.

Unvaccinated Masses: St Mary of the Angels have a Mass for the unvaccinated at 5.15pm each weekday, Monday to Friday. Please note that valid Vaccine Passes will now be required to be shown to attend their 7.00am Sunday Mass.

person. Sometimes we do mean or selfish things too, and we hope that God will forgive us.


