Precious Opportunities

The Lenten Sunday Gospels begin every year with the temptation of Christ in the desert. Luke's account, which we hear this year, outlines the temptations for material security (turning stones into bread), control and domination (power and glory of the kingdoms of this world), and physical certainty and safety (throwing himself from the parapet of the temple).

Every year, as Lent begins, I am challenged again by the retelling of these temptations in the Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent. I also know the temptation of immediate gratification from hunger or other desires, and the temptation for control rather than service.

However, with the smoke from the Ash Wednesday fires at Parliament still lingering in my senses and my memory, the temptation for physical safety speaks most strongly to me this year. In this third temptation, the devil even misquotes Scripture to Jesus. It is a reminder to be on our guard against the misuse of facts and even our religious texts and traditions.

Lent is a precious opportunity every year to turn back to God, in every sense of the world – through giving time and attention to **prayer** and our personal relationship with God; **fasting** which is our tradition of self-sacrifice for the good of ourselves and also the common good of all; and **almsgiving** which is recognising and loving Christ in our neighbours.

In this immensely challenging time, so much that we thought was "normal" seems to be denied to us because of the pandemic, the recent protest action and the challenges of strengthening buildings in our earthquake-prone country. It is good to spend time with Christ who began his ministry with a time of voluntarily denying himself through fasting, in order to discern between those distracting, tempting voices, and the true loving voice of God who cares for each of us and all of us.

With the protestors having now departed and the concrete bollards due to be removed over the next few days we look forward to getting back to normality. So long as there is no renewed activity around the area over this weekend Connolly Hall chapel will reopen on Tuesday, beginning with 8.00am Mass.

NEW PARISH OFFICE

A huge thank you to the volunteers who, at short notice, were able to assist in moving the parish office to our new permanent temporary location. This involved several hours of packing, moving, unpacking and reassembling 95% of the parish office from the Catholic Centre to our new office underneath Connolly Hall chapel and the decamping and disassembling of items in the Cathedral Music room and Vestry.

The office phone number is already operational and we have basic internet ability for now. We have commissioned work to get fibre internet installed and the necessary data and telephone jacks, power sockets and lighting, so hopefully before too long we will be fully operational again.

As normality around Hill Street returns we will be able to receive visitors again and look forward to greeting you in our new space. Our entrance is via the side door into the Cathedral foyer and then across the courtyard. Please ring the doorbell to the left of the Cathedral door and we will come and get you. Alternatively you can get to us through the back door of Connolly Hall chapel and down the two flights of stairs.
