# Laetare Sunday

Blaise Pascal wrote, ""The heart has its reasons which reason knows nothing of... We know the truth not only by the reason, but by the heart." This is showcased in this Sunday's gospel account in the parable of the prodigal son. While addressing this to the Pharisees and public sinners, Jesus reveals who God truly is - a Father who is unrelenting in showing love and tenderness so much so that He runs to his returning son with no questions being asked.

In contemporary culture with people leaving the parental home at a young age, this parable may not resonate until one realises that in the culture of Jesus' time, asking for one's share of the inheritance and leaving home was, in other words, to wish that the father was dead. To do what one wished with one's inheritance happened only after one's father was no longer alive.

Sin is a state of alienation, that of being away from the father's house, wasting our inheritance and living our life apart from Him; in other words: a joyless existence. In the gospel, Jesus mourns over Jerusalem saying, "how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were not willing." (Luke 13:34)

But deciding to turn back to God (or deepening our commitment to him) as did the prodigal son results in the experience of a joyful homecoming which is what this *Laetare Sunday* is all about. The entrance antiphon at today's mass proclaims: "Be joyful, Jerusalem, and all who love her!" This is done because she herself is loved by the Lord.

Having just crossed the midway point of Lent let us take stock of where we are in our relationship with God. Pope Francis in his last week's Angelus address mentioned that he likens the name for God as "God of another possibility." No matter how our journey has been thus far let us be open to that possibility. May we too have an encounter of joy and share it with those who need it the most.

### **CHANGES TO COVID PROTECTION FRAMEWORK UNDER THE RED LEVEL**

With effect from 11.59pm on Friday 25 March 2022 the gathering limit for indoor venues increases but there is still a requirement to keep social distancing at 1m. With the introduction of the new rules there will be no changes to the current gathering numbers for our parish Masses. However QR Codes and signing in will no longer be necessary. Cardinal John has reaffirmed that for the time being singing is still not permitted, however Proclaimers of the Word are no longer required to wear masks when proclaiming. Eucharistic Ministers are to continue to wear masks when they distribute Holy Communion.

From 4 April, in line with the dropping of vaccine mandates and My Vaccine Passes, all parish Masses will again be open to everyone with the compulsory wearing of masks continuing to be required.
