Ascension Sunday

Ascension Sunday can seem an unusual Feast, sandwiched between Easter and Pentecost. On one hand we have Easter, a time of great celebration, and on the other, Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit to the church.

But in-between, what? In-between Easter and Pentecost is Ascension Sunday. It is a going away of Jesus but also a waiting for the Spirit. The disciples cannot do anything because the spirit has not yet come!



The difficulty of course is that the easter events may have happened very quickly, sort of 'on top of one another.' The church has spaced them out for us, giving us an order to follow.

Today's readings are full of hope. Luke wrote a 2-volume work - Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of Luke. We begin with Acts – Luke writes to Theophilus, telling him of his 1st work, the life of Jesus, from its earthly beginning until after his death and resurrection, when he was taken up into heaven.

The 2nd reading is Paul writing to the Ephesians – often called the Ephesian hymn – it is a writing of pure beauty. In the Greek it is one long sentence! It is a beautiful passage for reflection.

Luke's Gospel gives his 2nd account of the Ascension. In both accounts there is a sense of mission, and of excitement. That is no different from ourselves. The mission given to the early disciples is ours also – to spread the Good News of Jesus to a hungry world.

The Feast of the Ascension is important. It is a celebration of the life of Jesus – pre and post resurrection, and the promise of the spirit to come.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 28 MAY TO 5 JUNE 2022



Below is an excerpt from the Homily of Pope Francis on 25 January 2022. The Week of prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated in January in the Northern Hemisphere.

In Bethlehem, after they had fallen down in adoration, the Magi opened their treasure chests and there appeared gold, frankincense and myrrh (cf. v. 11). These gifts remind us that, only after we have prayed together, only in the presence of God and in his light, do we become truly aware of the treasures that each of us possesses. They are treasures, however, that belong to all, and are meant to be shared. For they are gifts of the Spirit, destined for the common good, for the upbuilding and unity of his people. We come to see this by prayer, but also by service: when we give to those in need, we make our offering to Jesus, who identifies with those who are poor and on the margins (cf. Mt 25:34-40); and he makes us one.

The gifts of the Magi symbolize the gifts the Lord desires to receive from us. God must be given the gold, that which is most precious, because the first place must always go to God. It is to him that we should look, not to ourselves; to his will, not our own; to his ways, not our own. If the Lord is truly in the first place, our choices, including our ecclesiastical choices, can no longer be based on the politics of this world, but on the will of God. Then there is the incense, which recalls the 3 importance of prayer, which rises up to God as a pleasing fragrance (cf. Ps 141:2). May we never tire of praying for one another and with one another. Finally, there is the myrrh, which would be used to honour the body of Jesus taken down from the cross (cf. Jn 19:39), and which speaks to us of care for the suffering flesh of the Lord, reflected in the wounds of the poor. Let us serve those in need. Together, let us serve the suffering Jesus!

Dear brothers and sisters, let us take from the Magi directions for our own journey, and do as they did, returning home "by another road" (Mt 2:12). Like Saul before his encounter with Christ, we need to change course, to invert the route of our habits and our ways, in order to find the path that the Lord points out to us: the path of humility, fraternity and adoration.

O Lord, grant us the courage to change course, to be converted, to follow your will and not our own; to go forward together, towards you, who by your Spirit wish to make us one. Amen.


