

Inculturating the Gospel

This week we experience the juxtaposition on Friday of our Parish Feast Day of the Sacred Heart of Jesus with the newly established public holiday of Matariki. This is then followed on Sunday with the Gospel on discipleship and following Jesus.

The post-Synodal apostolic exhortation *Ecclesia in Oceania – The Church in Oceania,* by Pope John Paul II in 2001 helps our reflection. Following Jesus means being sent forth on mission. In our part of the world, this includes inculturation, the process by which the Gospel becomes embedded in the peoples and cultures of this region.

Pope John Paul II described inculturation as being born out of respect for both the Gospel and for the culture in which it is proclaimed. "The Church invites all people to express the living word of Jesus in ways that speak to their heart and minds."

The traditional celebration of Matariki marks core values which are shared with our Catholic spirituality. These include rememberance of those who have died; coming together as families and communities to share prayer, song and food; and care of creation. Our Parish Feast Day Mass marks this with special prayer for members of our parish community who have died in the past year.

We also remember the request for religious freedom at the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi, made by New Zealand's first Catholic Bishop, John-Baptiste Pompallier. In response, Governor Hobson verbally promised: *Ko ngā whakapono katoa, o Ingarani, o ngā Weteriana, o Roma, me te tikanga Māori hoki, e tiakina ngatahitia/ The faiths of England, of the Wesleyans, of Rome, and also of Māori custom shall be protected.*

As the spiritual descendants of Bishop Pompallier, we rejoice that people of all faiths in this land can hold and express spiritual faith and values. We also rejoice that there are opportunities to connect our inherited Catholic traditions with local beliefs and customs. Haere mai, come and join us this weekend.

RESUMPTION OF PARISH SINGING AND HOSPITALITY:

Following continued cases of Covid in our parish community, we are continuing to act cautiously in relation to the reintroduction of singing and regular hospitality. From the Parish Feast Day on 24th June the singing of responses to parts of the Mass will resume. Hospitality in the form of drinks and individual offering of food will be made available during hospitality after the Feast Day Mass. Normal weekend hospitality will resume from 3rd July with tea and coffee only at this point. From 2/3 July we will resume singing the responsorial psalm with a cantor leading the singing and the response sung by the congregation. Decisions regarding the resumption of further singing will be reviewed in mid July.


