Being a Bearer Of Good Tidings

One of the great joys for me as a missionary here in NZ has been to coordinate missions across various parishes across the country. This has been carried out in the context of prayer while attempting to sense where the Lord was inviting us to go on mission. This would be some task in organizing a group that could vary anywhere between a dozen to 16 members. The logistics involved in transporting the team, billeting them in homes, coordinating various outreaches to school, colleges and rest homes and also managing home visits in the parish area during that particular week of mission. It was wonderful though to see the young members step up and even share their personal testimonies with the congregations. Quite a few have even discovered they had a vocation to the religious life. Their encounter with God's goodness and the resulting joy we experienced made the efforts we had put into the preceding months worthwhile.

This Sunday's Gospel passage when Jesus sends out missionaries then does not need to be an experience relegated to the past. There are still not a few individuals and groups who in great earnestness respond to the call of being labourers in the Lord's vineyard. In more recent times, Pope Francis keeps reiterating that missionary thrust. Thus, in *Evangelii Gaudium* (n.27) he states:

I dream of a "missionary option", that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation. The renewal of structures demanded by pastoral conversion can only be understood in this light: as part of an effort to make them more mission-oriented, to make ordinary pastoral activity on every level more inclusive and open, to inspire in pastoral workers a constant desire to go forth and in this way to elicit a positive response from all those whom Jesus summons to friendship with himself.

It may be worthwhile to reflect on where, to whom and how I am being invited to bring forth Christ's presence today?

RESUMPTION OF PARISH SINGING AND HOSPITALITY
