Hospitality and presence

Hospitality is more than serving. It also includes being present, being attentive and listening to our guests. In this week's Gospel, Martha makes Jesus's comfort the priority by serving him, while Mary honours Jesus by giving him her full attention, even physically sitting silently at his feet. We listen to Martha, distracted by her service, complain to Jesus that Mary is no help to her and that she has been left to cope on her own. But Jesus, showing concern for Martha, says that Mary has chosen the better part.



In the parable of the Good Samaritan Jesus stressed the importance of action in the life of a disciple. In the story of Martha and Mary he stresses the importance of contemplation. To divide and divorce the Martha and Mary in each of us is a real temptation. Yet we do not need to choose between contemplation and action. It is not a question of either/or. Both aspects and attributes are important in our Christian life. The key is in recognising and choosing what to prioritise in each situation. When Jesus visited Mary, she set aside her usual work and gave him her undivided attention.

Our ideal aim as Christians is to have an active life fuelled by prayer, for it is when we are attentive to



Jesus that we clearly hear his voice, then we act. If Welcome and Serving feel overly burdensome for you, or a 'complaining' spirit is developing in your life, work, relationships, ministry, perhaps it is a good time to consider where the worry is coming from and talk to God about it?

than things that are fun. 2. Whenever you do something, say a prayer first.


