The Season of Creation began on September 1, World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on October 4, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology.

The Season of Creation is a time of grace that the Church, with other Christian Churches and Faiths offers to humanity to renew its relationship with the God and with creation, through celebration, conversion and commitment together.

Individuals and communities are invited to participate through prayer, sustainability projects and advocacy.

Prayer: Host an ecumenical prayer event as Christians unite on caring for our common home.

Sustainability: Lead a clean-up project that helps all of creation thrive.

Advocacy: Make one's voice heard for the care of our planet.

The theme this year is: *"Listening to the voice of creation."* During COVID many of us discovered creation in a new way. As the world stilled, we discovered the beauty of our world, be it through walking in our beautiful hills, listening to bird life, enjoying a gentle stream. We have also become aware of the voices of those who suffer the impacts of climate change. They are voices of people who possess ancestral wisdom about how to live with gratitude within the limits of Earth. They are voices of a diminishing diversity of species rather than humans. It is the voice of the Earth.

As Pope Francis wrote in Laudato Si', "Everyone's talents and involvement are needed to redress the damage caused by human abuse of God's creation'. All of us can cooperate as instruments of God for the care of creation, each according to his or her own culture, experience, involvements and talents." (LS 14).

Season Of Creation

1st September to 4th October

In Laudato Si', Pope Francis emphasised the importance of biodiversity. While the earth is the common heritage of all, he writes. 'It is not enough, however, to think of different species The Burning Bush merely as potential "resources" to be exploited, while overlooking the fact that they have

value in themselves. Each year sees the disappearance of thousands of plant and animal species which we will never know, which our children will never see, because they have been lost for ever. The great majority become extinct for reasons related to human activity. Because of us, thousands of species will no longer give glory to God by their very existence, nor convey their message to us. We have no such right.... Caring for ecosystems demands far-sightedness, since no one looking for quick and easy profit is truly interested in their preservation' (para 33, 36).

While our parish has been celebrating Masses at St Thomas More, we have been close to Ōtari-Wilton's Bush. This forest remnant is - along with Zealandia - a vital resource for biodiversity on the edge of the city. Take time to appreciate the combination of luck and far-sightedness that has given us this wild space.

Cost of living: Increase in people needing daily meals at the Soup Kitchen

In the past 12 months, the Compassion Soup Kitchen has had a steep increase in people needing their support, serving nearly 60,000 meals and delivering another 10,000 take-out meals to people in need. 

New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference

says hospices provide a free service to 20,000 palliative care patients and their whānau each year, but have to fundraise almost half the \$176 million cost.

Bishop Steve says: "When the public was asked at the 2020 election to support the euthanasia legislation – dubbed the End of Life Choice law – they were led to believe palliative care would be a priority choice. Instead, hospice funding has been virtually capped at a time of high inflation"
