To Guard One's Heart

The readings from the lectionary for the 26th Sunday places before us the obligation of being considerate towards those who are less fortunate around us.

In today's Gospel we find someone who may not have harmed anyone in any way but nonetheless bears the consequences of the sin of *omission*. Luxury and gluttony blinded the rich man in considering the needs of poor Lazarus. A disordered self-love blinded him in acting out in justice.

Reflecting on this parable Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI stated: Jesus admonishes us through the image of a soul destroyed by arrogance and opulence, who has created an impassable chasm between himself and the poor man; the chasm of being trapped within material pleasures; the chasm of forgetting the other, of incapacity to love, which then becomes a burning and unquenchable thirst. (Spe Salvi no. 44)

Scripture often uses a term, "hardness of heart," in describing the failure to listen to and respond to the Lord's Word. The rich man had failed to respond to the Old Testament call to respond to the needs of the poor: "If there is a poor person with you, one of your people, in any of your towns in your land which the Lord your God is giving you, you shall not harden your heart, nor close your hand from your poor brother/sister." (Deut 15:7)

For us Catholics, the Eucharistic celebration, which we celebrate in a special way with those receiving their First Communion today at our parish, reminds us particularly to have that "preferential option for the poor." St. John Chrysostom, a 4th century Church Father, drives home the point when he writes:

You honour this altar (meaning the altar of the Eucharist in the sanctuary) indeed, because it receives

Christ's body (at the Eucharist). But the poor man, who is himself the body of Christ, you treat with scorn, and when perishing, neglect. You can see this altar (meaning the altar of the poor) lying around everywhere, both in streets and in marketplaces, and you can sacrifice upon it every hour; for on this too is sacrifice performed.

Let us ask the Holy Spirit to quicken within us that grace of where and how we might respond to God's word we hear generously mindful that the Lord loves a generous giver (2Cor9:7).

In Laudato Si' Pope Francis emphasised the importance of social justice as well as ecological justice: 'we have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor'. This theme appears often in the Scriptures.

The Hebrew Scriptures warned against over-farming and over-exploiting. In Psalm 85 we read:

God's help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land. Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. The Lord will bestow his goodness and our earth shall yield its fruit.

ANOINTING MASS

The sacrament of Anointing the Sick is administered to bring spiritual and physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death.

"The special grace of the sacrament has as its effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church; the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age; the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of penance; the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul; the preparation for passing over to eternal life" (CCC 1532).



If you or someone you know would like to avail themselves of this Sacrament, please come along to the 8.30am Saturday morning Mass in the Connolly Hall Chapel on 1 October. Fr Alliston will be the celebrant.
