CELEBRATION SUNDAY

This weekend we mark Celebration Sunday and remember Meri Hohēpa, the Venerable Suzanne Aubert, founder of the Sisters of Compassion. Suzanne Aubert's life was a long act of faith. She believed that God should be given credit for everything she did and she abandoned herself to God and thought only of pleasing Him. Duty was the hallmark of her life. This weekend is an opportunity to honour the wonderful works of this great woman, to take her legacy as a guide for our lives.

The readings for the weekend fit well with her life. The second reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy could have been written with Suzanne Aubert in mind. 'Fan into a flame the gift that God gave you". Suzanne Aubert spent her life following this edict. But we should listen to the exhortation of St Paul too. He wrote this to Timothy from prison and this could be considered to read as a master instructing his apprentice on how to carry on his work in his absence. But it is also directed at us. Can we ignore the statement that follows: 'God's gift is not a spirit of timidity but the Spirit of power, and love, and self control.' How can we stay silent and hide our gifts and talents in the background letting others take lead having heard these words. We need to act!

What follows are strong authoritative words that we cannot ignore. 'Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious, guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.'

Suzanne Aubert had a simple, blind, trusting faith in God and it was her example of using her gifts of love and compassion that inspired others to join her in religious life. She constantly extoled all to see God in the ordinary people that needed care and attention on the periphery of society. While we pray for the true recognition of Suzanne Aubert that would come with Sainthood we cannot ignore the call to follow her lead by having our actions directed by a true compassion. May her words be our guide: "Let us love God alone. Let Him be really ours and let us be really His. Let Him reign in us, and let us live in Him. He is ever near us with His kindness and mercy, which He desires to pour on souls."

In Laudato Si' Pope Francis emphasised the importance of social justice as well as ecological justice: 'we have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor'. This theme appears often in the Scriptures.

The Hebrew Scriptures warned against over-farming and over-exploiting. In Psalm 85 we read:

God's help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land. Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. The Lord will bestow his goodness and our earth shall yield its fruit.

LAUDATO SI' ACTION PLATFORM



It's seven years since Pope Francis issued his landmark encyclical letter 'Laudato Si' – **Caring for our Common Home**. We've reflected on this encyclical from time to time in our parish newsletter. The Vatican's Dicastery for Integral Human Development has established the Laudato Si' Action Platform, working with all people of goodwill to address the ecological crisis. Our Archdiocese has signed up to this platform, which means working together to discern appropriate ways of doing this. Cardinal John, and some members of the archdiocese Ecology Justice and Peace Commission and other friends, will join us for our **Sacred Heart Cathedral parish Mass at 10.30am, Sunday 2nd October at St Thomas More Church**, Wilton, to mark this commitment. This is the last Sunday in this year's Season of Creation, and the feast of St Francis of Assisi is Tuesday 4 October.

ANOINTING MASS

The sacrament of Anointing the Sick is administered to bring spiritual and physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death.

"The special grace of the sacrament has as its effects: the uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ, for his own good and that of the whole Church; the strengthening, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old age; the forgiveness of sins, if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of penance; the restoration of health, if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul; the preparation for passing over to eternal life" (CCC 1532).



If you or someone you know would like to avail themselves of this Sacrament, please come along to the 8.30am Saturday morning Mass in the Connolly Hall Chapel on 1 October. Fr Alliston will be the celebrant.
