Blindness

In the Gospel this week, we see how the Pharisees "suppress the truth by their wickedness" (Romans 1:18) because they refused to believe in the miracle of the curing of the man who was blind since birth. We live in times when the truth is so easily buried or twisted by misinformation, sensationalism, political correctness, and wokeness. Fiction is being peddled as fact, and fact is relegated to the darkness of obscurity, if not oblivion. History is being rewritten to serve the agenda of those who seek to oppress the marginalised, the poor. Many are blind to the truth of our Lord because

they are unwilling and unable to change their lives. Many are shackled in darkness to the trappings of lies, of bigotry, of hate.

In contrast, we see how the man who was cured of his physical blindness was also cured of his spiritual blindness. We see his faith grow as he goes from "The man called Jesus", to "He is a prophet", then "He is one who does God's will". When Jesus first healed the blind man, he didn't see Jesus. His obedience, following Jesus to wash in the Pool of Siloam, cured his physical blindness. His encounter with our Lord gave him a steadfast spirit that he was able to stand against the Pharisees. Ultimately, the once blind man said, "Lord, I believe" and worshipped Jesus.

We encounter our Lord in every person we meet, in every moment of our lives, and in every word of scripture. When we encounter our Lord we should open not just our eyes, but our hearts and minds as well. "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." (Psalm 94:8) Like the blind man, obedience is the first step. Following our Lord, keeping our eyes on him and not allowing ourselves to turn a blind eye from the truth; can lead us to a spiritual awakening and shine our Lord's light in our hearts.

"If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32)

PARISH LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES

Come and Be Reconciled with Yourself, Others and God!

We began our Lenten journey with the invitation of prophet Joel: "Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and relents from punishing" (Joel 3: 13) and have progressed to the fourth week of our preparation for the feast of Easter. Lent certainly is a time of cleansing and nurturing holy desires and deepening our longing for God. The best way to cleanse us is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is the tangible expression of a loving Father's desire to find his children again. The Church encourages us to confess at least once a year and to receive Holy Eucharist during the Easter time. The parish is offering you an opportunity for Reconciliation Rite II on Sunday 2nd April at 4.00pm. "Come now, let us talk this over, says the Lord. Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow. Though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool" (Is 1: 18).

Preparation for Palm Sunday—Friday 31st March, St Thomas More Church 7.00pm Stations of the Cross, Flax Cross making & shared dessert/supper

Come along to St Thomas More Church for a Stations of the Cross service. After this we will make flax crosses from arakeke (NZ flax) for Palm Sunday. There will be people to demonstrate how these are made. When enough crosses are made everyone can enjoy dessert/supper. Please bring some kai to share. The flax



crosses will be used by all Masses on Palm Sunday. The crosses will help us express the Easter story and are beautiful to keep even when they dry out. Tickets for our Easter Raffle Hamper are available for purchase after our Vigil and Sunday Masses.





This volunteer role requires a commitment of up to 8 hours per week. Catholic Social Services (CSS) are looking for someone who is passionate about enabling former Refugees to get a great start in their new life in Aotearoa NZ.



CSS collaborates with Red Cross, , other Catholic parishes and community groups in the Wellington area providing household goods to assist in the resettlement of people arriving into NZ via refugee pathways.


