Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

'Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.'

Easter Sunday is **THE** moment when everything makes sense, the moment of faith.

Certainly, in all 4 gospel accounts, there are regular statements by Jesus as to his resurrection, but they are not understood.

What brings about the change? John's Gospel describes in detail the condition of the grave clothes and their distribution, but that is all they see, and yet it is enough. It is as if the very fact of the Resurrection



makes faith now accessible to Peter and John and subsequently to Mary and the other disciples. We are told of the beloved disciple that *'he saw, and he believed'*. He did not see the Lord with his physical eyes, but with the eyes of faith, the faith that now can be accessed by those who know the Lord as a gift, the fruit of the Resurrection.

That is true of ourselves today. We do not even see a few scraps of linen cloth, but who can *'understand the teaching of the scripture'* through the gift of faith that comes as a gift to those who, like Peter and John racing to the tomb, seek the crucified Lord and find that he is indeed risen.

We who gather for the Easter Liturgies are like the first disciples, granted the gift of faith that comes from being loved by the Lord and seeking him.



Today let us thank God for the gift of faith. Just be thankful for what we have.

THE POPE'S WORLDWIDE PRAYER NETWORK

Pope Francis has made a point of inviting everyone to join him in prayer around a particular theme each month. This month of April he asks us to 'pray for a more widespread culture of non-violence, that will progress when countries and citizens alike resort less and less to the use of arms'. Pope Francis says:

Living, speaking, and acting without violence is not surrendering, losing or giving up anything, but aspiring to everything. As Saint John XXIII said 60 years ago in his Encyclical Pacem in Terris, war is madness. It's beyond reason. Any war, any armed confrontation, always ends in defeat for all.

Let us develop a culture of peace.

Let us remember that, even in cases of self-defence, peace is the ultimate goal, and that a lasting peace can exist only without weapons.

Let us make non-violence a quide for our actions, both in daily life and in international relations. And let us pray for a more widespread culture of non-violence, that will progress when countries and citizens alike resort less

and less to the use of arms.

Alleluia?

Today is the biggest feast of the year! Jesus rose from the dead on the first Easter Sunday. By rising from the dead, He showed that He was God and that everything He had said was true.
