NOT SEVEN TIMES, BUT SEVENTY-SEVEN TIMES

In today's Gospel Peter suggested that one should forgive his brother seven times, in answer to his own question. Why seven? In maths, seven is a prime number that has some exciting properties. It is the largest single-digit prime number; it is a Mersenne prime number; and it is a prime factor of seventy-seven – Jesus' reply to Peter's question.

I digress. Peter, perhaps, suggested seven times because seven is one of the most significant numbers in Judaism; the great King David was the seventh son in his family (1 Chronicles 2:15), Exodus 23:10-13 describes how the seventh year, and the seventh day is beloved and holy. God created the world in six days, and rested on the seventh; Sabbath, the seventh day, is holy and strictly observed. Maybe Peter wanted to show how well he understood scriptures, and how well he follows their traditions. Jesus' reply to Peter was 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times.' Our Lord wasn't asking us to keep a scorecard; but instead, we should forgive as many times as it takes. And really, at times, it is hard to do so.

In his letter to the Romans, St Paul states that love is the answer to every one of the commandments. That love is the one thing that cannot hurt our neighbour. Resentment, anger, and hate hurt our neighbours and in turn, hurt ourselves. We are called to forgive as the Lord forgives us our sins. We are called to forgive because we are called to love. Our faith, accepting in our hearts our Lord Jesus Christ as our saviour, invites us to love with the same love that our Lord has for us. And through his love, we may be able to forgive even if it is beyond our human strength.

By the way, if you take the letters of 'Christ', using each letter's position in the alphabet C = 3, H = 8, R = 18, I = 9, S = 19, T = 20, the sum is seventy-seven.

Living Laudato Si' - Caring for Our Common Home Together

Pope Francis in Laudato Si' tells us that "the poor and the earth are crying out". Our individual efforts towards sustainability can seem insignificant. Every trip to the supermarket provides dilemmas as we strive to make an ethical choice.



- Buy NZ Made or a cheaper alternative imported from far away, perhaps from a country where workers are exploited, and environmental concerns are ignored.
- Read ingredient lists carefully and avoid palm oil because of the 'environmental footprint associated with deforestation, biodiversity loss and greenhouse gas emissions, particularly in Indonesia and Malaysia'.
- Discover that "vegetable oil" is code for "palm oil" and so it is present in many processed foods.
- Decide to stay with butter without additives only to learn that most NZ cows are fed on palm kernel for some parts of the year.

The decision making is not easy but let your purchases reflect your values. Embrace the Christian spirituality that proposes moderation and appreciation. The world and the quality of life of the poorest are cared for with a sense of solidarity and awareness that we live in a common home that God has entrusted to us.

HAVE YOU HAD YOUR SAY? - CHURCH LIFE SURVEY

What is the Church Life Survey?

It is an nationwide survey of church attenders, run every 5 years in line with NZ Census years. Every church is invited to take part. This 2023 survey will have higher participation than the 2018 survey. This is the first time the Wellington Archdiocese has taken part. The Auckland Diocese have been using this survey for many years and Archbishop Paul believes the resulting information will be of great benefit to our parishes and the Archdiocese at large.

The 2023 survey is administered by the Christian Research Association of NZ, in partnership with Wilberforce Foundation and Auckland Church Network. These organisations want to strengthen & support the NZ Church by equipping leaders with quality research & data. The survey questions were compiled by experienced church researchers & leaders from a range of denominations & movements. All information provided is anonymous and no individual names are collected.

Why participate in the Church Life Survey?

- Our church and parish has significantly changed since the COVID pandemic.
- The survey provides an opportunity for our leaders to find out who is part of our church and their demographic profile.
- As our leaders want to listen to your opinions. The survey provides a great method for hearing all the voices in our parish.
- As our leaders want to be informed in their decision making. The survey provides a robust evidence base for making decisions.
- The health of our people is important. The survey provides a snapshot of the spiritual health of our church and
