Love is the Answer

Our Lord Jesus' response to the question raised by the Sadducees is not unfamiliar to us: 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. And you must love your neighbour as yourself'. It's easy to say that we do. But in these times, it seems we find more reason not to love our neighbour, let alone love God above all else. With all the violence around us, war, crime, misinformation, hate to name a few; to love our neighbour may seem to be a daunting task, a complex ideology. When people find themselves, or the ones they love, victims of senseless violence or having a terminal illness, or experiencing life altering misfortune, loving God seems to be the last thing that comes to mind, the last thing to ponder in their hearts. How, then, do we heed our Lord's call to love.

In his first letter, St. John affirms that 'God is Love' (1 John 4:7-21). We should 'love one another, because love comes from God.' St. John reminds us that 'God showed his love for us by sending his only Son into the world, so that we might have life through him. This is what love is: it is not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the means by which our sins are forgiven'. Despite our sinfulness, God loves us unconditionally. And so that we may love and live our lives in union with God, he gave us his Spirit.

The lyrics of the song 'Love is the Answer' (England Dan and John Ford Coley) tells us to 'love one another' - when we're afraid, when we're lost, alone, far from home, down and out, hopeless, needing a friend, and near the end. Our fears, our worries, and our anxieties are all driven by fear. In love, there is no fear. God's love sets us free – free from sin, free from fear. With this freedom, we are able to love God above all, and love our brothers and sisters as our selves.

Finally, St. Paul tells us 'I may have the gift of inspired preaching; I may have all knowledge and understand all secrets; I may have all the faith needed to move mountains but if I have no love, I am nothing (1 Corinthians 13:2).

PRESENTATION OF PALLIUM

Next Sunday 5th of November at St Mary of the Angels 5.00pm Mass, the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Novatus Rugambwa will invest Archbishop Paul with the Pallium. All are welcome.

The Pallium is a white woolen band with pendants in front and back worn over the chasuble by the Pope or a Metropolitan Archbishop. It symbolizes the close relationship between the Bishop of Rome and the local Church. The Pallia for all newly appointed Metropolitan Archbishops were blessed by Pope Francis in Rome on 29 June 2023, the feast of Ss Peter and Paul. The bishops of New Zealand will be present as the bishops' conference starts in Wellington the following day.



NOVEMBER - THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

During the month of November we especially remember our family members and friends who are now with God. From the beginning of the month a box will be provided in the entrance where you can place the names of your deceased loved ones. The box will be placed before the Altar during the entrance procession where the names are offered up as part of our Masses.

Parish Memorial Mass: Each year during November, the month of the Holy Souls, the Parish celebrates a Mass in memory of those who were called home to God in the previous 12 months and have a connection with the Cathedral.

This year we will celebrate this memorial as part of the 5.30pm Mass on Saturday 11 November.

Everyone is very welcome as we remember those who have died and prayerfully support those who grieve their passing. All are very welcome to join us for this special commemoration. At the beginning of Mass, we will invite a representative from those families to light a candle of remembrance that will shine in memory of their loved one throughout the Mass.

All Souls Remembrance Service

This Thursday, 2 November 6.00pm

We write to invite you and your family and friends to a special All Souls joint service between Metropolitan Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and Wellington Cathedral of St Paul.

The Choir of Wellington Cathedral of St Paul will be leading our sung worship, which will feature MIHA, a new setting of the Requiem Mass in Latin and Te Reo Māori by Auckland-based composer Takarei Komene.

During the service we will remember in prayer those who have died in the last year. Cards will be available for you to fill out the name of a loved one you would like to be read out during our prayers of remembrance. There will also be an opportunity to light a candle in remembrance of your loved one.

The service will last around 75 minutes, providing time and space for reflection, and seeks to bring comfort in offering God's peace and the reassurance of our Christian faith and hope. We do hope you will be able to attend, and look forward to welcoming you. This service is in addition to our regular Masses in our Connolly Hall Chapel which will be at 8.00am and 12.10pm on that day.



TAIZÉ


Inspired by communities in France, Taizé incorporates music and chanting into a restful and reflective practise. Join our Sisters for a Taizé session in our chapel.

Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation - 1 (God is Rich in Mercy)

Dear Parishioners,

We will very soon be entering into the season of Advent which invites us to focus on the absolute necessity of our getting ready for Christ's "Homecoming" into our hearts and lives by true repentance, reparation, prayer, and the renewal of our lives. The best possible preparation that we could make for welcoming Jesus at Christmas is to examine our lives, repent, and to confess our sins to begin a new life.





On Easter night, the Risen Jesus appeared to his apostles and said: "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20: 21 – 23). Christ instituted the Sacrament of Penance for all sinful members of the Church. It is a sacrament whereby the sins whether mortal or venial, which have been committed after baptism are forgiven and the sinner is reunited to the Church and to the life of grace. This sacrament gives strength to the soul to be a better Christian.

"The Lord Jesus Christ, physician of our souls and bodies, who forgave the sins of the paralytic and restored him to bodily health, has willed that his Church continue, in the power of the Holy Spirit, his work of healing and salvation" (CCC 1421). The Code of Canon Law states that; "In the sacrament of penance, the faithful who confess their sins to a legitimate minister, are sorry for them, and intend to reform themselves, obtain from God through the absolution imparted by the same minister forgiveness for the sins they have committed after baptism and, at the same, time are reconciled with the Church which they have wounded by sinning". (Can. 959).
