There is a Season...

Last Sunday we began a new church year, beginning with the Season of Advent. We are now in Year B, and the Gospel of Mark.

Mark's Gospel is often under-rated, compared with Matthew and Luke. It is considerably shorter than the others, and was even seen at one time as an abridged version of Matthew!

Nothing could be further than the truth. Mark is written earlier than Matthew and Luke and it shows! Mark mentions details that are eye witness accounts in a way that Matthew and Luke simply cannot. It is also true that both Matthew and Luke have access to Mark's Gospel, and make good use of it. Their own accounts would be severely depleted if it were not for Mark's influence on their own writings. Enjoy Mark this year. It is a beautiful gospel.

We are also in the Season of Advent – only 22 days this year. Advent is when we prepare for the great Feast of Christmas. It is an inner journey. There are many ways we can prepare. Even if you cannot get to daily Mass, you can always download the Mass readings and just reflect on them. I try to spend time by myself and be with the Lord. I think of Mary and what she must have been thinking as she carried Jesus in her womb. waiting for the time for him to be born. Can we not prepare ourselves in the same way!

This particular year is also a time for goodbyes and welcomes. Both Fr Joy and myself will be leaving the Cathedral Parish, I am going to Holy Cross Seminary as senior-priest-in-residence and Fr Joy is taking my

place as Parish Priest at Otari Parish. The Cathedral parish will be welcoming Fr Patrick Bridgman as Administrator. You will be blessed indeed to have Fr Patrick with you. Finally I would like to acknowledge Debbie Matheson and the Leadership team. It's no secret that Debbie does a fantastic job, supported by a great Team. You are indeed a fortunate parish.

CATHEDRAL PARISH PASTORAL APPOINTMENTS FOR 2024

We have received the welcome news of the appointment of Fr Patrick Bridgman as Administrator of the Cathedral Parish from 1 February 2024. Fr Patrick, together with Debbie Matheson, our Lay Pastoral Leader form the new Pastoral Leadership Team of the Cathedral Parish. Fr Viator Muyuni has also been named as Priest-in-Residence at Viard House while he completes his Doctorate.

A Bishop of a Diocese is himself always the Parish Priest of the Cathedral. He delegates the pastoral care of the parish to the Administrator and the Pastoral Team. Hence Fr Patrick's title is Administrator of the Cathedral Parish. Though recently the term Parish Priest has been used in our parish it was done so for ease of understanding.

We are very grateful to Fr Ron, who has for several years been Moderator of the Cathedral Parish. He has been incredibly generous in his ministry assisting the pastoral work among us and sharing his priestly wisdom. From 2024 he has been appointed to Holy Cross Seminary in Auckland to take up the role of Senior Priest in Residence.

We also thank Fr Joy Thottankara who has been our Assistant Priest this year. Fr Joy has been appointed as Parish Priest of Otari parish, working alongside Fr Tikoua Kautu, Assistant Priest. We look forward to working with him again next year, in a different way. Fr Joy is going home to India for a holiday from 26th December.

There will be a parish opportunity to offer our thanks and farewell to both Fathers Ron and Joy after our 10.30am Sunday Mass at St Thomas More Church on 17th December. From this weekend there will be farewell cards in the entrance at all Masses for you to pen a personal note, or you may send one into the parish office and we will add to the card.

ADVENT RECONCILIATION

The Advent Season is all about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. The best preparation that we could ever make is to prepare our hearts for Jesus. There will be opportunity for individual Reconciliation on 9th, and 16th of December 2023 (Saturdays) after the 8.30am Mass at the Connolly Hall. There will also be an Advent Reconciliation Service (Rite II) on Sunday 17th December 2023 at 4.00pm in St. Thomas More Church, Wilton.

AN ADVENT REFLECTION

Many of Pope Francis' weekly general audiences include some teaching on a particular theme, going over several weeks. These can be read on the Vatican website at https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/audiences.index.html#audiences In Advent 2016 a theme was 'Christian hope'. An extract from 7 and 14 December 2016:

Particularly in this Season of Advent, which is the time of waiting... it is important to reflect on hope. Let us allow the Lord to teach us what it means to hope. Therefore let us listen to the words of Sacred Scripture, beginning with *the Prophet Isaiah*, the great Prophet of Advent, the great messenger of hope...

Isaiah Chapter 52 begins with the invitation addressed to Jerusalem to awake, shake off the dust and chains, and put on the most beautiful clothes, because the Lord has come to free his people (vv. 1-3). And he adds: "my people shall know my name; therefore in that day they shall know that it is I who speak; here am I" (v. 6).

At this point, the prophet includes a song of exaltation:

"How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good tidings, / who publishes peace, who brings good tidings of good, / who publishes salvation, / who says to Zion, 'Your God reigns' Break forth together into singing, you waste places of Jerusalem; / for the Lord has comforted his people, / he has redeemed Jerusalem./ The Lord has bared his holy arm before the eyes of all the nations; / and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God" (Is 52:7, 9-10)...

We must pray, that each day God may give us hope and give it to everyone: that hope which arises when we see God in the crib in Bethlehem. The message of the Good News entrusted to us is urgent. We too must run like the messenger on the mountains, because the world cannot wait, humanity is hungry and thirsty for justice, truth, peace.

SIMBANG GABI - A FILIPINO CHRISTMAS TRADITION

Christmas Novena Masses is a four-century-old tradition in the Philippines. It is practiced around the world everywhere there are Filipinos. Filipinos were traditionally farming people, and they greeted the dawn of a new day in the fields while working the land. The missionary fathers decided to integrate the early start to Filipinos' day with preparing ourselves for Christ's birth during Advent, resulting in the Christmas Novena Masses.

During Advent, the missionary friars held nine days of Masses leading to Christmas Day which were celebrated typically at about 4:00 AM when the roosters crow to announce the coming of a new day. Hence, it is called "Misa de Gallo". Now, the Christmas Novena Masses are also known as "Simbang Gabi", which literally means "Evening Mass" (so you don't have to get up for 4am!).

This year the Christmas Novena Masses will be celebrated at St Teresa's, Karori, sharing this Filipino Christian tradition with the whole community. Everyone is invited to experience this preparation for Jesus' birth as one community in Christ.



First, we should try to be holy like Saint Paul says. We should pray and do good. Then, we should make sure that we have repented of all our




