# Was Jesus just having a bad day?!

The account of the cleansing of the temple occurs in each of the four Gospels. It is not all that common that an event in the ministry of Jesus is across all the Gospels. Interestingly, whereas in Mark, Matthew and Luke (the Synoptic Gospels) this event occurs later in his ministry, in John it happens at the beginning of his ministry following the wedding feast at Cana.

What then is John inviting his early Christian community to ponder? For John's community, the Temple, destroyed in 70AD, is no longer a place of worship. John, in recalling the cleansing of the temple, is explaining that in Jesus' life, death and resurrection the Temple as the place of worship has been surpassed. It is with, through, and in Jesus that we give praise and worship to his Father.

The temple Jesus speaks of is his body, and we now are his body. As St Teresa of Avila has been attributed with saying: "Christ has no body but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but vours."

The Sacred Heart Cathedral is nearly complete, a few months to go! And it is being beautifully strengthened and restored. Recently some stunning mosaic and marble steps were 'discovered' and will now be visible to the worshipping community again.

Lent is a time for us to 'restore' the living body of Christ; you and me. For us to discover anew aspects of our true life which may have become unstable or covered over through the past year.

We will have a beautiful Cathedral in which to welcome others. May this Lenten season enable our own beauty to also radiate, so that we may truly reflect the beauty of the Body of Christ.

### **OUR LENTEN JOURNEY**

From Pope Francis' 2024 Lenten Message: Lent "is a season of conversion, a time of freedom" because "God does not want subjects, but sons and daughters" and, citing the Book of Exodus, he emphasises that the Word of God addresses each one of us personally today: "I am the Lord, your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery". Along these lines, the Holy Father emphasises that "it is time to act, and in Lent to act also means to pause. To pause in prayer, in order to receive the word of God, to pause like the Samaritan in the presence of a wounded brother or sister" because "love of God and love of neighbour are one love".

Our parish is offering opportunities for you to come together to read, explore and pray with each coming week's Sunday Gospel reading, and to communally pray the Stations of the Cross. The times for these are:

Scripture reflection - 6pm in Connolly Hall chapel on the following Wednesdays - 6, 13, 20 March Stations of the Cross – 7pm in Connolly Hall chapel on the following Fridays - 1, 8, 15 March

If you are not able to commit to every session please do join us whenever you are able.

### Fr David Dowling appointed Seminary Rector

Father David Dowling has been appointed as the new rector of Holy Cross Seminary in Auckland. Fr David is at present the Human Formator at Holy Cross. He will take over the role in April from the present Interim Rector, Bishop Emeritus Colin Campbell. Fr David is a priest of the Archdiocese of Wellington whose priestly journey began when he entered Holy Cross in 2001 after a career as a Customs officer.

"I am inspired and encouraged by the teaching of Pope Francis, who sees priestly formation as service, not simply as the transmission of a body of teachings, but also the art of concentrating on others, bringing out all their beauty and all the good that they carry within."

### Updated statement on respect for life

The NZ Catholic Bishops Conference has revised and expanded *Te Kahu o Te Ora – A Consistent Ethic of Life* to inspire active protection and promotion of all life.

NZCBC President and Bishop of Auckland Stephen Lowe says the bishops want every Catholic to read *Te Kahu o te Ora*: "We are confident that reflecting on the document will foster hopefilled conversations that will lead to attitudinal change and positive action towards a better world in which all life is consistently treasured and protected."

In the old times, people would bring animals to offer as sacrifices to God. By the time FATHER'S HOUSE that Our Lord was born, there were people who were selling animals right in the area of the Temple. In today's Gospel reading Jesus drives the animals and money-changers out of the sacred space.

At one time the men who sold the animals for sacrifices were probably really helping the people who came to the Temple from far away. But now they were just trying to make money, and they were taking up space that was supposed to be used for people to worship God.

We also have sacred spaces like the Temple. Every Catholic church is a special place made for worshipping God in the Mass. We should always behave respectfully in church, and remember that Jesus is really there in the tabernacle. We can show our respect by walking quietly, not talking inside the Church unless it is
