Welcome Home!

Did you feel the space as you came through the foyer? Did you look up as you entered the nave and see the beautiful ceiling, now white and duck-egg blue? Did your eyes look to natural coloured Oamaru stone, the painting of the Sacred Heart and then lower to the Annunciation Altar, and the mosaic tiling? Did you notice the feeling of lightness and spring?

We have been on a journey. It could be termed a pilgrimage! Since the Cathedral was closed in 2018 the parish has gathered at St Paul's, at St Mary's College, at St Thomas More's, and always in our own Connolly Hall Chapel.

It can be exciting to be away, to experience new things, different settings and scenes, yet there is something about coming home.

Not every language has a word with the connotation of the English word, 'home'. Most languages have a word that names the dwelling in which people live, such as house or residence, yet home brings to mind and heart so much more. There is a warmth to the word 'home', which is beyond description. It is more a 'felt reality'. Over this weekend we will express our thanks to many. We will gaze with delight at all the creativity that has been unleashed. We will notice aspects which are still to be completed or may need further tending. Yes, we are home. In this time may our hearts notice that throughout this pilgrimage of some six years the Lord has always been at home in us, and we have made our home in Him.

How good it is to be home, and how good it will be to welcome others home, whether they are new to the parish or returning. Welcoming all to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and to St Mary, his mother.

Welcome Home

As we celebrate the reopening and our return to worship in the Cathedral this weekend, below are some updates on various aspects of the restoration campaign.

Organ: The pipe organ from the recently closed St Benedict's Church, Khandallah, has been placed in the Cathedral. It is a joy to have the use of this organ until a time when it is hoped the Hobday organ is restored.

Blessed Sacrament Chapel: The refurbishment of the Chapel, including the protective work for the stained-glass windows is still in progress. Therefore, weekday Masses will be celebrated in the nave until this work is completed.

Parish Activities: it is our joy to again be in the Cathedral for liturgies,



and between the Cathedral and Connolly Hall for other activities. Naturally, with work still to be completed by the end of the year, there will be times when access may need to be changed or restricted. Thank you for your continued patience, understanding and assistance. The contractors are expected to be on-site until later this year.

Fundraising: We are fortunate to have secured enough money through a temporary loan, to complete the restrengthening and internal restoration work to enable us to return to worshiping in the Cathedral. We are still short approximately \$720,000.00 to complete the entire restrengthening and restoration. Money is still required to complete work on the outside western face of the Cathedral, the Blessed Sacrament chapel and various other small areas in need of attention. Fundraising efforts will continue beyond the restoration campaignwhen we turn our attention to raising funds for a permanent organ for the Cathedral.

Thank you: We sincerely thank all who have donated funds to the restoration and ask for your continued support as we continue to raise the funds necessary to complete the project. If you are able to make a donation, please see the Cathedral campaign website <u>www.cathedralcampaign.org.nz</u> or use the 'tap and go' facility in the Cathedral foyer. No donation is too small. We also wish to thank LT McGuinness and all the contractors who have been working tirelessly on the Cathedral to enable us to reopen this weekend. They, guided by our wonderful Project Architect, Jane Kelly of Team Architects, heritage architect Paul Cummack, and Barry and Dave from Monastra Quality Surveyors, have skilfully steered us through the restrengthening and restoration. While we are not yet finished, we are truly grateful and blessed to be journeying with you all.
