Welcome home – Our mustard seed has flowered!

Even a little mustard seed can produce a bountiful harvest. We do not know where the wind may blow the seeds that we sow, nor where the seeds will land. But it doesn't matter, for the harvest is God's and we are not in control. Our role is to till, tend, and nurture, and when the time is right to support the harvest.

Last weekend, as we returned home, we experienced the fruit of our labours. The little seeds that had been transplanted in 2018 and tended for nearly six years had grown. And what a beautiful bounty it has produced, returning to God what is God's. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament


Is available on Thursdays in the Cathedral from 7am until 7pm. Everyone is welcome to make a visit during these hours.

Matariki 2024: Cultural Celebration on Friday, June 28th

The Matariki public holiday, a significant event in the New Zealand calendar, is set to unfold on Friday, June 28th, 2024. Established in 2022 to commemorate the Māori new year and recognise the cultural heritage surrounding Matariki, this special day is strategically positioned on the Friday closest to the new moon following the rising of the Matariki star cluster. In today's Gospel reading Jesus tells us about the Kingdom of Heaven. Heaven isn't just where we will go when we die if we were good. Jesus was telling us that Heaven grows in our hearts

when we choose to love God and each other.

Our Lord compares the Kingdom of Heaven to plants that grow up from little seeds. When we were baptized we received the gift of Faith. When we receive the other

sacraments, especially Holy Communion, the Faith grows in us, like a plant that has water and sunshine. If we sin it's like little bugs or sickness that start to kill the plant. Confession will take those away so that our Faith can grow again.

How can you help the Kingdom of Heaven to grow in you? Going to Mass and receiving Holy Communion whenever you can, and going to Confession often are the


best ways. Praying every day and learning about the Faith and about the saints will also help the Kingdom of Heaven to grow in your heart like a strong, healthy plant!
