When People are Sick ...

In today's Gospel reading we hear about Jesus curing the sick. Jesus wants us to follow His example and care for the sick and dying. But we can't do miracles like Jesus did! What can we do?

Here are some ideas:

1. If someone in your family is sick, maybe you can help them out! Ask if you could read them a story, or help them by bringing them anything

they need. A 'Get Well' card would be nice too!

2. Always pray for people who are sick. Your prayers can help them get better, or they might help your sick friend to understand why God is letting

them suffer.

What about when you are sick? When you are sick or hurt, think about Jesus suffering on the cross. Offer your pain to Him and tell Him that you want to suffer with Him so

that people will be saved from their sins. Be thankful for people who help you when you are sick. Remember, they take Jesus' place!
