Sharing is Caring

Whenever Sandra prepares a meal, there is always more than enough for us as a family and I always complain and ask her, why did she cook so much? Her response is always the same and very simple – "because I love you!" This usually stops my complaining in its tracks.


In both our first reading and Gospel today, we see great acts of love, not only in the feeding of the nearly 5,000 by Jesus from five loaves and two fish or the 100 people that Elisha instructed his servants to feed with the 20 loaves but we also to see the love and generosity from the man from Baal-shalishah and the little boy who offered up their gifts for these miracles to be performed.

We are often trapped into believing that we need to make great offerings for us to experience miracles. These readings are a great reminder that God can do great things with the little that we are willing to offer, but it must start with us offering up something. I am reminded of the saying "Sometimes a smile can help a person achieve in a second what would otherwise take a great deal longer." All we need to do is to show love, and God will take care of the rest.

I often joke that I inherited the art of eating lollies from my pocket without anyone knowing from my mother's side of the family – my uncles are masters at this. I imagine the young boy in today's Gospel reading could have done with a lesson or two on how to hide his food. He had packed enough to allow him to follow Jesus for a while and now found himself having to give it all up. St Paul reminds us about being "humble, gentle and patient" and living in unity – "one body and one Spirit". To do this we need to work together, care for one another and put others first. This is what both the "providers" in our readings did – they offered what they had for the benefit of all.

The miracle of the bread and fish is of course a precursor to Jesus offering himself up for all of us – the ultimate sacrifice, but is also shows us that we have a responsibility to help and support each other because that is what makes the world a better place.

We can show that we love and care by cooking a meal that can last for a few days, or through a smile to a stranger on the street. It does not matter how big or small our contribution is, just leave it to God to work the miracle.

Cathedral Sanctuary and inner courtyard work

From Monday 29 July to Wednesday 7 August inclusive the sanctuary area of the Cathedral will again become a work site, with scaffold being erected to allow installation of further lighting and the completion of painting in this area.



During these dates, a temporary altar will be set up at the foot of the sanctuary steps and Masses will continue to be celebrated in the Cathedral. However, on Monday 29 July and Monday 5 August the Cathedral will be closed to the public as the scaffold is erected and dismantled. There will therefore be no Rosary or Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion on these two dates only.

Inner courtyard closure - From Wednesday 31 July, until further notice, the inner courtyard will be closed as further external work is carried out in this area.

Between Wednesday 31 July and Friday 2 August scaffolders will be carrying scaffolding through the main foyer doors across to the inner courtyard. Please take care when accessing the Cathedral and fover during this time.

28 July— Fourth World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly for Grandparents

This year's theme, "Do not cast me off in my old age" (cf. Ps 71: 9), recalls the heartfelt plea to the Lord not to be left alone in old age. All too often, in fact,

loneliness is a bitter companion in the lives of the elderly due to numerous contingent situations, such as the migration of children or the crisis of families, or due to the individualistic mentality that makes those who are advanced in years feel like a burden. It seems that everyone takes for granted that there is a time in life when one remains alone. It is a habit and a mentality to which, with resignation, even the elderly do not object.

Yet, as the Holy Father reminds us, God never abandons His children. Not even when strength wanes or life seems less productive. Indeed, in the Bible, growing old is a sign of blessing. The loneliness and abandonment of the elderly is not inevitable, rather the result of wrong choices that do not recognise the infinite dignity of each and every person.

Jesus still multiplies what we give Him today. At Mass we offer to God some bread and wine and He turns it into the Body and Blood of Jesus!




We have something to offer to Jesus too. If you offer your work, or your talents, or even your whole life to God, He will use your gifts to bring His blessings to the world.
