REFOCUSING

This weekend we enter the season of Advent, a season of anticipation, and we begin again the church's liturgical year. The focus of our readings in the first two weeks of Advent are on the second coming of Christ at the end of time. Then, on the third Sunday, our focus moves to His first coming in Bethlehem.

Advent is also a time for remembering; a time of invitation, conversion and transformation; and continued witness. As a season it symbolises hope, joy, faith, love and peace, which is highlighted each week as we light another candle on the advent wreath.

Throughout Advent we are reminded that Jesus not only comes to us, but that we are to come to Him.

I know only too well how, in the busyness of the secular world, it can be challenging to find the stillness we need to hear God, especially so in the Advent season. Yet, this week that is what the scriptures this week remind us to do. Jesus tells us to stay vigilant – to be ready for Him and to make ready our way to Him. He reminds us not to let the anxieties of daily life make us drowsy, forgetful, or neglectful of preparing our hearts for him.

I can recall many periods in my life where I have felt distracted and neglectful. However, I have been fortunate during my recent recovery from back surgery to have been gifted with the opportunity of a period to refocus, to be more vigilant. This was a real blessing, as during this period I found myself even more in need of time to sit with and receive God's tender love and guidance.

Like the experiences of many others in our parish and in Wellington in these times of financial constraints, I have been advised that my position as Lay Pastoral Leader is impacted by Archdiocesan changes needed in response to their financial constraints. In response I have accepted redundancy. This will take effect in early March 2025 when the restrengthening and restoration work of the Cathedral winds up. I do not yet know what the next chapter of my life holds, but with vigilance and time God will reveal that to me.

So, as we light the first candle of the Advent wreath this weekend, may we all find comfort and hope in the direction offered to us in the words of scripture, seek the time and space to pause, to listen, and walk in the pathways of God.



Coming to the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a wonderful feature of Advent preparation for Christmas. On **Thursdays 5, 12, 19 December** Reconciliation will be available between **6 – 7pm**. There is also the opportunity to ask one of the priests before/after Mass at other times.



First week of Advent

Advent is a journey towards Bethlehem. May we let ourselves be drawn by the light of God made man. Pope Francis

Each Sunday during Advent, one candle on the Advent wreath is lit. The primary colour of Advent is purple which symbolises royalty. As a whole the candles represent the coming of the light of Christ into the world. The circular shape of the Advent wreath symbolizes God's infinite love for us – it is never-ending, just like the true Light of the World, Jesus, who leads us into eternal life with Him. Each candle has a name assigned to it and symbolises a virtue.

This week we light the first of the purple candles. It is named the Prophecy Candle in remembrance of the prophets, primarily Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ: It represents hope or expectation in anticipation of the coming Messiah. Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. (Isaiah 7:14)

Remembrance and recommitment ceremony (Rā Maumaharatanga) at Korokoro cemetery:

You are welcome to join a peaceful hikoi starting beside the grave of famous chief Wi Tako at the Catholic Cemetery on the corner of Pito-one Street and Korokoro Rd on Sunday 1 December 2024. Assemble at cemetery from 1:30pm. Our kaupapa will be to recall and pray for the tipuna interred in this important site and learn about our shared histories. It is also a reminder of the joint kaitiakitanga of this special place, cared for by Wi Tako's descendants, the Love whanau, parishioners from Te Wairua Tapu / Holy Spirit parish, and the Hutt City Council. Wi Tako was buried at Korokoro in 1887 from St Peter and Paul's church in Lower Hutt.

Following the service we will proceed – by foot or vehicle – for 15 minutes to Te Puni urupā in Te Puni Street, then another 15 minutes to Sacred Heart Church, 41 Britannia Street to share stories and a cuppa. During Advent you can try extra hard to be good. It is also a very good idea to go to confession before Christmas so that


