
Reconciliation is available Wednesday & Friday from 11.50am until 12.00 midday and Saturday after the 8.30am Mass and by appointment.



Good Friday Holy Places Special Collection

Archbishop Paul has received a letter from Cardinal Gugerotti who is the Prefect of the Dicastery for Oriental Churches. His letter relates to the situation in the Holy Land and the plight of Christians there and the challenges for the holy places. As you can imagine things are very tough at this time and his letter is encouraging us to support this collection as we can.

Particulars = Your Initial and Surname




