## Ascension of Our Lord

We are coming to the end of the Easter season. For six weeks we have celebrated the joy and glory of Christ's resurrection. We have listened as Jesus revealed himself to his friends and disciples. He was truly present beside them, talking to them and sharing their lives. Now it is time for him to leave his friends behind and return to his Father. We mark his departure with the Solemnity of the Ascension of our Lord.

*'So, then the Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them,  
was taken up into heaven  
and took his seat at the right hand of God.'* Mark 16:19

Mark's gospel continues...

*'But they went forth and preached everywhere,  
while the Lord worked with them  
and confirmed the word through accompanying signs'* Mark 16:20

Our lives can follow similar twists and turns, ups and downs, joys and sorrows. Each of these can bring new challenges, happiness, or pain. In this way our lives mirror the disciples' experiences - from the high of Christ's resurrection, lulled into a place of comfort as Jesus spent time with them, then the sudden loss. We can learn from the gospel of the day that Jesus did not leave the disciples and the same is true for us. He is still present with us, beside us, leading us - if we have faith.

The Ascension was not an ending but the beginning of something new for the disciples and it can be for us too.

### Fiji mission

Otari CWL are delighted to announce, a very favourable surprise telephone conversation from our Mission Community in Nbala, Fiji, run by the Sisters of Our Lady of Nazareth. The communication has been very spasmodic and sometimes not at all. Anne Lumb has been able to reconnect with Sr. Ana Vuka, who used to be with the school and has since returned, and better communication has now resumed.

Hurricane Yasa made a hole in the convent roof and they'll need timber and paint to fix it; tiles for kitchen and carpet previously requested; there are 100 girls at the school and 2 Sisters; some of their girls are from single parent families and have only one school uniform which they wash every day and dry overnight. Otari branch will be applying for CWL Mission Education Grant for the school, but if parishioners would like to donate towards our Mission Community, a boost to what we can send them, would be most welcome. 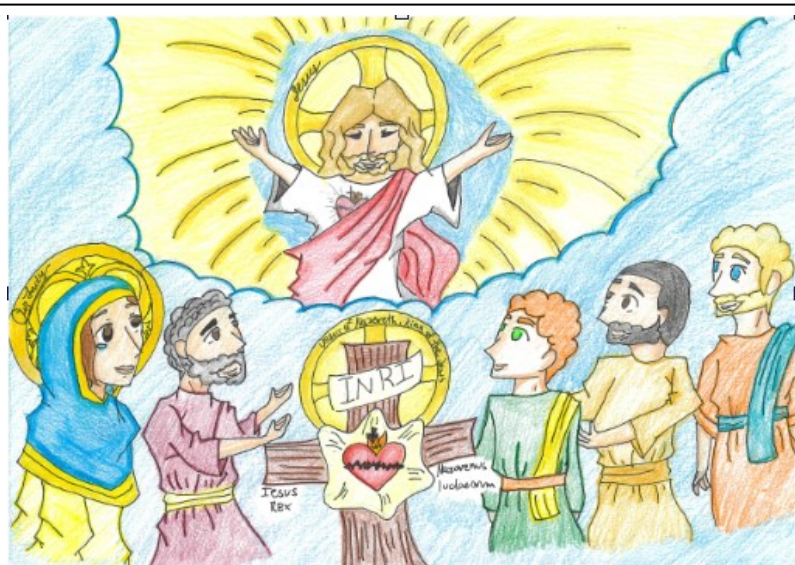
## Gospel Interpretation from Sacred Heart Cathedral School students
