The Spirit is not confined

This weekend we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples. The story, as told by Saint Luke in Acts, is familiar enough. It's perhaps easy to think that this was the end of the story, or at least that everything was sorted and that the disciples got on with things. It wasn't all sorted, of course. Differences and divisions didn't take long to arise. We read in Acts, for instance, of arguments about some groups of widows receiving less support than others, and of arguments about how closely Jewish law needed to be observed. There were, as Saint Paul makes clear, even factions around one person or another.

This week, in the Southern Hemisphere, was the beginning of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The Week was first proposed in 1908 by an American Franciscan, Paul Wattson, and became more widely observed after 1948 when the new World Council of Churches adopted it, and still more with the greater emphasis on ecumenism in our own church after the Second Vatican Council. Whereas Wattson's view was that unity meant reabsorption of other churches into the Roman communion, in the 1930s a French priest, Paul Couturier of Lyons, suggested that the prayer should be "for the unity of the Church as Christ wills it, and in accordance with the means he wills".

I'd like to offer some ways of thinking about Christian unity. First, many of us have spouses or other close family who are members of other Christian communities and traditions. For us, Christian unity is a matter of daily life. Similarly, many if not most of us will have friends in other faith traditions, from whom we learn much. In other ways, too, perhaps the path to unity is (as the sportswear slogan says) 'just do it'. We can just pray for each other. There are opportunities at various times to share worship with our neighbours, which we might take up. In doing this, as well as in reading thinkers in other communities, we appreciate the unique gifts of each tradition. As we read in St John's gospel, the Spirit blows where the Spirit wants to.

Let Yourself Be Useless by Henry Nouwen

Prayer is not a way of being busy with God instead of with people. In fact, it unmasks the illusion of busyness, usefulness, and indispensability. It is a way of being empty and useless in the presence of God and so of proclaiming our basic belief that all is grace, and nothing is simply the result of hard work. Indeed, wasting time for God is an act of ministry because it reminds us and our people that God is free to touch anyone regardless of our well-meant efforts. Prayer as an articulate way of being useless in the face of God brings a smile to all we do and creates humor in the midst of our occupations and preoccupations.

Thinking about my own prayer, I realize how easily I make it into a little seminar with God, during which I want to be useful by reading beautiful prayers, thinking profound thoughts, and saying impressive words. I am obviously still worried about the grade! It indeed is a hard discipline to be useless in God's presence and to let him speak in the silence of my heart. But whenever I become a little useless, I know that God is calling me to a new life beyond the boundaries of my usefulness.
