Safeguarding Children is the proud founder and sponsor of Child Safeguarding Week in Aotearoa New Zealand. The theme of Child Safeguarding Week 2022 is **How safe are our children?** 

We want every week to be Child Safeguarding Week. Every day, wherever they are and go, our children need to be protected from abuse and neglect. We all want our children to be safe when we are not with them. Child Safeguarding Week provides a platform to promote prevention of abuse by asking "How Safe are the places your children go"?

Child Safeguarding Week is held annually in Aotearoa New Zealand to raise awareness of child abuse prevention wherever children are — at home, the community, places they go. The objective of the week is to raise the profile of issues connected with child abuse prevention and child protection.

When a child is abused, the physical and mental trauma can last a lifetime. Protecting children from abuse is the responsibility of us all. You can support Child Safeguarding Week by raising the safeguarding standards of the places your children and other's children go.

Together we will make a difference!

## **Key Messages**

Child Safeguarding Week empowers you with the tools to demand better standards for all children. The following statements are the Key Messages we'd like to convey with Child Safeguarding Week. Please use these in any of your posts or in a way that works best for you.

- Every child has the right to be in a safe environment, wherever that is, without fear of abuse
- Every child has the right to be heard by an adult trained in child protection, and supported by them
- Organisations working with children must always have staff available who are trained to recognise and respond to signs and disclosures of abuse
- Individuals who work with young children in any capacity must have training in recognising and responding to signs and disclosures of abuse
- Child abuse is preventable
- Every week should be Child Safeguarding Week. Every day of every week, our children need to be protected from abuse and neglect everywhere they go.



## **Countdown to Child Safeguarding Week**

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## What can you do during Child Safeguarding Week?

#### 1. Sign a petition – a call to action!

Sign our petition to change the Children's Act 2014 and then share the petition link on your social media channels. Here is the petition link:

Here is some messaging you can use:

- The Children's Act isn't doing enough to protect our children from people who are a risk to them at the places they go.
- The Children's Act only applies to organisations that receive government funding, yet children will attend organisations, clubs and groups that receive no government funding.
- The Children's Act doesn't include police vetting or reference checking of volunteers, meaning a volunteer wanting to abuse a child can slip through, and they do.
- Children deserve better and so do we as parents and carers.

#### 2. WATCH and SHARE a FREE 30-minute webinar on safeguarding in organisations.

Parents and caregivers have high levels of concern, expectation and trust in organisations to keep their children safe. However, there is a disconnect between their expectations and the actions that organisations take to ensure children are safe.

This webinar will introduce you to the core elements of a child safe organisation and the steps an organisation can take to make their places safer for children. You will be guided to the development work your organisation needs to make to move forward on this journey.
